## CONDITIONS OF PLAY

All matches will be played under the Rules of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association (revised 1951).

Ball: The Villa (XXX) Ball will be used in all events.

Dress: Players must wear Grey or Dark Clothing in all matches; tennis shoes must be worn. The Tournament Manager reserves the right to scratch any player who does not conform to the above rule regarding dress.

The Committee reserves the right to seed the draw.

The referee's decision in any dispute on a point of law is final. The decision of the umpire in any dispute of fact is final.

Competitors must report to official in charge on arrival each night.

Amount of back play will be 14 feet. Amount of side play will be approximately 9 feet. Light will be 600 candle power for each table.

Matches commence at 7 p.m. each night. The Tournament Manager reserves the right to scratch any player who arrives late.

Entries, accompanied by fees, must reach the Hon. Secretary (Mr. J. J. Dunne, Box 1702, Christchurch), by Wednesday, 3rd September, 1952, at 4.30 p.m. Entrants for Junior Events must bring their age certificate properly attested.

Events 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, shall be best of five advantage games of 21 points up; all other events shall be the best of three advantage games of 21 points up.

Play shall be continuous from the first service until the match be concluded, provided that necessitated by circumstances not within the control of the players, the Umpire may suspend play for such period as he may consider necessary. Play shall never be suspended for the purpose of allowing a player to recover his strength or his wind. The Umpire shall be the sole judge of foul play, and after giving due warning he may disqualify the offender. The "Pushing" rule and time limit regulations will be enforced.

The Tournament is under the control of the Tournament Manager, Mr. A. B. McCallum. The referee is Mr. F. H. G. Johnstone.

Should power restrictions necessitate the postponement or abandonment of the Tournament, outside competitors will be given at least one week's notice and will receive a refund of fees.
