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CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. All Matches will be played under the Rules of the N.Z. Table Tennis Assn. (Inc.)
2. Ball: The Halex (three star) Ball will be used in all events.
3. Dress: Players must wear Grey or Dark clothing in all matches; tennis shoes must be worn. The Tournament Manager reserves the right to scratch any player who does not conform to this rule regarding dress.
4. The Committee will seed the draw.
5. The referee's decision in any dispute on a point of law is final. The decision of the umpire on a point of fact is final.
6. Competitors must report to the officials in charge on arrival at each session.
7. Amount of back play will be 10 feet. Amount of side play will be approximately 9 feet. Lighting will be 600 candle power for each table.
8. Matches will commence as per programme below. The Tournament Manager will scratch any player who arrives late unless prior arrangements have been made with the Tournament Manager.
9. Entries accompanied by fees must reach the Tournament Convener, Mr A.B. McCallum, 116 Milton Street, Christchurch 2, by Friday, 19th June 1964 at 5 p.m.
10. Events 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 shall be best of five advantage games of 21 points up; all other events shall be the best of three advantage games of 21 points up. Entrants for Junior Events must have their age certificate properly attested.
11. Play shall be continuous from the first service until the match is concluded, provided that when necessitated by circumstances not within the control of the players, the Umpire may suspend play for such period as he may consider necessary. Play may never be suspended for the purpose of allowing a player to recover his strength or wind. The Umpire shall be the sole judge of intentional delay and, after giving due warning, he may disqualify the offender. The Expedite Time Limit regulations will be enforced.
12. The Tournament is under the control of the Tournament Manager, Mr A.B. McCallum, and the Assistant Manager, Mr M.A. Cox. The Referee is Mr C.A. Clarke and the Assistant Referee, Mr R.B. Hart.
13. Players must attend at all sessions, except Friday night session - when visiting players only will be exempt.
14. There will be a strict enforcement of two minutes only for knock-ups.
15. Players must play on tables allocated or may be disqualified.
16. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
17. No prizes will be awarded in any event unless there are four or more entries in that event.
18. The "Pushing Play" expedite rule will be enforced. A copy of these rules will be posted in the building.
19. Racket standardisation: Competitors and umpires should note the following wording of Law 4 of the Laws of Table tennis:

"The racket may be of any size, shape or weight. Its surface shall be dark coloured and non-reflecting. The blade shall be of wood, continuous, of even thickness, flat and rigid. If the blade is covered on either side this covering may be either (a) of plain, ordinary pimped rubber, with pimples outward, of a total thickness of not more than 2 mm.; (b) of 'sandwich', consisting of a layer of cellular rubber surfaced by plain ordinary pimped rubber - turned outwards or inwards - in which case the total thickness of covering of either side shall not be more than 4 mm."

Note: "Dark coloured" means dark red, dark green, dark brown, dark blue or black.
