

HELEN MORROW:

Captain - age 20 years - from Armadale, Melbourne, Victoria

right-hand attacking player complete economics degree at Melbourne University 1974 and attends Monash University this year taking Diploma

of Education for Secondary school teaching

Represented Australia at the 1975 Commonwealth Championships at Melbourne and at the world Championships at Calcutta, India Ranked No 5 in Australia; No 3 in Victoria

Represented Victoria in Australian championships for both junior and senior ranks Best win overseas was when she beat Violetta Nesukaitis of Canada in world consolation singles at Calcutta India.

CHRISTINE LITTLE:

19-years-old changed State allegiance from South Australia to Victoria because of better opportunities for table tennis in Melbourne. First represented Australia sainst Czechoslovakia last year (1974) and again selected for 1975 Commonwealth and World Championships. Right handed, single and winner for two successive years 1973 & 1974, of the Michael Szabados trophy for best and fairest junior player in Australia.

CANTERBURY TEAM

JAN MORRIS:

Jan is one of the best women's Table Tennis players, produced by Canterbury. From early coaching as a junior by New Zealand's coach Mr T. Flint, Jan established an outstanding record as a junior and is now ranked No 5 in New Zealand. Later in 1974 Jan received coaching in Japan and has improved her game as a result. Jan is the Present South Island champion and has won every other South Island title she has played in this season. Jan plays for the top Christchurch club Avonside.

PHILLIPA MARKS:

Ranked No 3 in Canterbury and No 9 in New Zealand in 1974, Phillips is improving her ranking both in Canterbury and New Zealand each season. A very consistant defensive player, she has a 100% record in representative matches this season. From the University Club Phillips is also an outstanding golfer.

BIRBARA TAYLOR:

From the Selwyn Club, represented Canterbury many times as a junior and senior. A fine all round player, Babara was ranked No 2 in Canterbury and No 6 in New Zealand in 1974. Barbara is a very good doubles player and will feature in this event for this match.
