

FORTYSEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Executive Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration the 47th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts covering the activities of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association Incorporated, during the year ended 31 October, 1980.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership situation is not clear, with many variations with the figures submitted last year which require to be checked through. The difficulty in supplying the figures could be blamed on the new design of the membership return. It is intended next year to have a simple form with three categories only, i.e. number of clubs, teams and members.

AROUND THE COUNTRY

* NORTHLAND TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION HEADQUARTERS. One of the most modern table tennis facilities in New Zealand will be the Northland Table Tennis Association's new headquarters at Kensington Park, Whangarei. Built with voluntary labour, and with some assistance from the Programme Employment Project plan, serviced by the Department of Labour, the \$150,000 stadium accommodates seven championship tables. Because of the great assistance received from the Northland business community the building is costing the Northland Association about \$70,000. This money has come to hand as a result of various fund raising efforts, the biggest one being a Super Blockbuster lottery organised by James Morris which netted \$30,000. The new stadium is to be opened in April, 1981.

* Kaitaia Table Tennis Club: held its annual general meeting on Tuesday 3 June and there were 25 people in attendance. Officers were elected and it was pleasing to see a lot of new faces playing on the tables and the interest was running high. (It is presumed that the Kaitaia Club and its members are included in the membership return of the Northland Association KCW).

* Thames Table Tennis Club: At the Club's annual meeting, members decided to elect five people to share the post of club captain. Members also felt it was necessary to write a new rule "to strike a blow for decency and discipline". The new rule is "Any club member who misbehaves inside or in the precincts of the War Memorial Hall shall be expelled forthwith by special meeting". A retirement from the club of Mrs. Cathy Milner, the person "who handled every facet of the club's running with the ease of a kindly silicon chip", was received. The meeting concluded with the election of officers.

* Paeroa Table Tennis Club: The club season is now in full swing with good attendances on club nights. The season began with the presentation of prizes. Officers were elected. With the Thames Valley Table Tennis Association going into recess several years ago, inter-club games are not now played on a regular basis. However, there are still several clubs operating in the Valley and opportunity is taken to play these clubs at least once a year. Paeroa recently played host to a team of 12 from the Morrinsville Club. There were many close encounters, but Paeroa proved too strong overall and ran out comfortable winners 39-10. A return match is to be played later in the year.

(From the several clubs operating in the Valley, surely there is someone prepared to accept the challenge of reviving the Thames Valley Association, to provide organised competition for the benefit of their members - (KCW)

* Change of name: The Northern Hawkes Bay Association is now registered as the "Hawkes Bay Table Tennis Association, Incorporated".

* New Table Tennis Club: The newly-formed Karori Table Tennis Club has made an excellent start to its first season and a good number of keen players, both junior and senior, are making full use of the new tables every Tuesday evening in the Karori Community Hall. The club is affiliated to the Wellington Association with five teams in the inter-club competition. The club feels a debt of gratitude to the Karori Lions whom, in initiating the setting up of the new club, made a donation of \$750. This, together with a grant from the City Council, made it possible to purchase six top-class tables.

* Table Tennis in recess: With an attendance of seven members at a meeting of the Geraldine Table Tennis Club (South Canterbury), those members attending agreed that the club should go into recess. Members expressed regret and disappointment, as table tennis was once very strong in the district with teams from Orari, Pleasant Valley, Hilton, Woodbury and Rangitata in the competition.

* Table Tennis Club in good heart: All is in good heart at the Te Awamutu Table Tennis Club which holds its meeting every Monday night at the St John's Parish Hall. The club came out of three-year recess last Monday and to mark the occasion, a teams competition was held with sufficient numbers present to team up two eight-a-side ladies and men's teams.

* Table Tennis win: The South Taranaki Club team took out the "A" grade competition and managed runner-up position in the B grade of the North Island Workingmen's Club table tennis competition held in Hawera, 31 May. Four teams contested the A grade competition and five played in the B grade. Teams came from Hawera, Kamo, Papatoetoe, Onehunga, Otahuhu. (A record of the number of people using table tennis facilities at Workingmen's clubs would give a boost to the figures we seek in the annual membership return from Associations - KCW)

* Personal tribute: A well deserved tribute to a long serving record as Secretary/Treasurer of the Poverty Bay Table Tennis Association, together with her interests in model aeroplane racing, was made to Mrs Rosalie A. Douglas when she was selected as the recipient of the award, Poverty Bay Sportswomen's Service to Sport. The NZTTA joins with others in extending congratulations to Mrs. Douglas.

NEW ZEALAND JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

(a) Inter-association team contests: 20 boy's and 18 girl's teams in the under 18 years age group and 20 boy's and 14 girl's teams in the under 15 competition competed for the junior inter-association teams honours in the three grades A, B and C. at the Walter Nash Stadium, Taita.

Because of an accident to one of their players, the Rotorua's girls team, under 18, B grade, was withdrawn. The Nelson C grade team was promoted to fill the vacancy and a Hutt Valley second team was utilised to fill the gap.

The all-powerful Auckland under 18 boy's team had no difficulty in taking the Hawkes Bay shield, winning every match by wide margins. Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson, the country's two top rated juniors, both completed the teams tournament with unbeaten records.

Auckland also won the Bob Lassen shield for the under 15 years "A" grade section, which speaks well for the depth in Auckland of talented juniors.

In the girls' section, Hutt Valley took the title when they beat the more fancied Auckland team 6 - 5, after disposing of the other association teams easily. The Auckland team slipped a further notch when Otago surprised by beating them 6 - 5 with the Fogarty sisters, Barbara and Catherine upsetting the New Zealand representative Christine Prendergast.

Hutt Valley girls completed a fine double by winning the under 15 "A" grade section to take the Ron Gibbons shield with an unbeaten record.

N.Z. Junior Individual Championships: There were large increases in the under 18 and under 16 years individual events. Overall the increase was 1.23% for the under 18 events and 17.50% for the under 16. There were 103 and 108 entries for the boys' singles events under 18 and under 16 respectively. But there was a fall away in the under 14 (-4.89%) and under 12 (-40.90%). In total the junior events had 813 entries as compared with 765 the previous year.

In his report on the conduct of the championships Mr A.R. Harding, the N.Z. observer, commented, "The tremendous growth in the junior sector is a reward for coaching and promotional development in the schools".

Gary Haberl and Matthew Walker (Australia) took the under 18 and under 14 singles respectively, but Barry Griffiths (Auckland) held on to the under 16 title when he beat the brilliant Australian Gary Haberl in an exciting and remarkable scoring final. In the third and final game of this contest, Haberl led 20-9 but failed to hold on to this substantial lead to let Griffiths take the game and match at 22-20. The score in favour of Griffiths was 14-21, 21-10, 22-20.

The doubles winners showed that Griffiths and Peter Jackson and Griffiths and Kadia Rice dominated the events, while Wendy Cuthbert (Hutt Valley) had a field day winning both the under 18 and under 16 singles titles as well as being a partner in the winning combination that took the girls doubles under 16 title.

In the under 14 and under 12 events, Gary Traill (Northland) took the three events (singles, doubles and mixed) in the under 12 section and shared the mixed doubles under 14 title with Yvonne Cuthbert (Hutt Valley).

Eileen Hoete (Franklin), D.J. Houlihan (Northland) and Yvonne Cuthbert (Hutt Valley) also had a good tournament in the girl's age group events.

Association Award - Bill Hurrey Cup

Barry Griffiths (Auckland), Wendy Cuthbert (Hutt Valley) and the Traill brothers (Northland) collected the most points in the various finals.

The combined total scored by Gary Haberl and Matthew Walker, the Australian juniors, who won the boys' singles under 18 and under 14 respectively did not count in the assessment of the award.

The final points for the 1980 award were:- Auckland 18, Hutt Valley 14, Northland 8, (Australia 6), Bay of Plenty 4, Franklin 4, Otago 4 and Manawatu 2.

SENIOR INTER-ASSOCIATION TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS

An entry by the Bush Association, which was received after the date set for the acceptance of entries, was refused, leaving an even 23 teams in the men's and women's sections respectively.

The Auckland Association has a stranglehold on the "A" grade sections of both the men's and women's competition with the men taking the Kean Challenge shield for the fifth year in succession, while the women, not to be outdone, chalked up a record six years in succession of engraving on the Herbert G. Teagle Memorial Challenge Shield.

The Auckland's men's team included the current New Zealand champion, Graham Lassen and former New Zealand championships in Richard Lee and Kerry Palmer and close behind there was the up and coming youngsters, Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson. It was a strong team on paper as well as on the table.

Similarly the Auckland women's team with the new New Zealanders, Christine Lee and Mary Cannon and the New Zealand representatives, Shelley Palmer and Lynda Dyer also had class and were unbeaten. *Christine Henderson*

While Manawatu men swept all before them in winning the B grade, they were unable to upset Wellington in the promotion-relegation contest and remain in the B grade.

The Fogarty sisters and Ruth Foster took the women's B grade comfortably and went on to beat North Taranaki to win promotion to the A grade next year.

The men's C grade saw Hawkes Bay win promotion to the B grade in the year which the Hawkes Bay Association will be conducting the next teams championships.

There were not further promotions in the other grades, thus demonstrating that the teams are correctly graded.

NEW ZEALAND NATIONAL OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The association of the New Zealand agents of Olympic Swiss Watches and to a lesser degree the involvement of Broadlands, with the Hutt Valley Table Tennis Association in the promotion of the 38th New Zealand national open championships at the Walter Nash Stadium, Taita, was a major feature of the success of the championships.

The championships had Vice-Regal Patronage when the Governor-General, Sir Keith Holyoake attended the finals and later presented the prizes. The Mayor of Lower Hutt, Mr John Kennedy-Good and Mrs Kennedy-Good were also present.

In a comprehensive report which has been widely circulated, Mr A.R. Harding, the New Zealand observer, summed it all up when he wrote, "It was a terrific effort by the Hutt Valley....."

INTER-ISLAND CONTESTS

The annual inter-island contests played in conjunction with the holding of the New Zealand Junior Championships at the Walter Nash Stadium, Taita, Hutt Valley on Friday evening 29 August, 1980, resulted in a 7-5 win for the North Island in both the men's and women's contests.

In the men's contests all the singles and the first two doubles were shared at 5 matches all. It was up to the last two doubles to decide and both went to the North Island. The Canterbury men's team represented the South Island with credit. Maurice Burrowes beat the NZ champion Graham Lassen, 17-21, 25-23, 21-16 and Stuart Armstrong the South Island captain did all that was expected of him beating the top North Island players, Malcolm Temperley 21-19, 21-14 and Richard Lee 21-15, 21-14.

At the end of the first half of the women's contests the score was even at 3-all, but in the second half, the South Island lost all the singles played and although they pegged back the score by taking the final two doubles, they could not bridge the gap giving the North Island a winning lead of 4-2 to take the final score to 7-5.

The inter-island contests were played at the same time as the finals of the under 16 singles and doubles titles. While this scheduling added interest for the spectators it was unfortunate for 16-year-old Kadia Rice (Bay of Plenty) who had been selected for the North Island women's team but was involved in the junior finals. Her place was taken by the first reserve and NZ Junior representative, Lynda Dyer (Auckland) to make the North Island team fully representative from the Auckland Association.

NORTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Juniors were to the fore at the 1980 North Island Championships conducted by the Manawatu Association at the Barber Hall on 5/6 July. There were 385 entries for the junior events, a 19% increase over the previous year.

The under 18 and under 16 age groups were dominated by the Aucklanders, Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson and by Kadia Rice from the Bay of Plenty.

A similar pattern emerged in the under 14 and under 12 years events with the Traill brothers (Northland) and Yvonne Cuthbert (Hutt Valley) showing to advantage.

In the open events the outstanding junior Barry Griffiths caused upsets when he beat the No 4 seed, Kerry Palmer (Auckland) and went on to beat Malcolm Darroch (Manawatu) to reach the semi-final where by the narrowest of margins he failed to reach the final losing to Malcolm Temperley (North Shore), 19-21, 21-19, 20-22, 17-21, 20-22. In the other semi-final Richard Lee (Auckland) beat the North Island selector, Geoff Rau, 21-11, 21-16, 21-16.

In the final Richard Lee had many an anxious moment before he beat the 20-year-old Malcolm Temperley (North Shore) in five games, 14-21, 18-21, 21-17, 21-19, 21-18.

Griffiths with his team mate, Peter Jackson also reached the semi-finals of the men's doubles before losing to Temperley (North Shore) and Armstrong (Canterbury) in three games. The final of the doubles saw the established New Zealand pair of James Morris (Northland) and Richard Lee (Auckland) have little trouble in disposing of Temperley and Armstrong 21-17, 21-19, 21-19.

The women's singles was a triumph for the New Zealand champion, Jan Morris (Canterbury) who again established her superiority over Shelley Palmer (Auckland) in the final, 21-19, 22-20, 21-14. In the semi-finals, Morris beat the top seed and former Australian champion, Christine Lee while Palmer put paid to the chances of another Australian, Mary Cannon.

Canterbury took their second title when Maurice Burrowes and Jan Morris were successful in the mixed doubles beating Richard and Christine Lee (Auckland) in the final, 21-16, 21-16, 23-25, 19-21, 21-15.

Good quality entries made the championships a curtain-raiser for the New Zealand Championships and the under 18 years players were out to impress the New Zealand selectors for inclusion in the New Zealand Junior Team to participate in the Australian championships.

In his report on the conduct of the championships, the New Zealand Executive representative, Mr J. Lelliott, congratulated the Manawatu Association for a well organised tournament and for the excellent facilities provided for the competitors.

SOUTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

The fortieth South Island open and junior championships were successfully conducted by the South Canterbury Association at the Aorangi Sports Stadium, Timaru 21/22 June, 1980.

The championships were made interesting by entries from Auckland, Franklin, Hutt Valley and Wellington. The North Island juniors, Gavin Laughton (Franklin) and Lynda Dyer (Auckland) dominated the under 18 years events and their successes did not go unnoticed by the national selector, Mr. R.J.Menchi who was present as the New Zealand Executive representative.

Stuart Armstrong (Canterbury) swept all before him to take his first South Island men's singles title and with his opponent in the final, Michael Hamel teamed together to retain their men's doubles title.

As a coincident the men's singles final was a complete reversal of last year's final when Hamel scored his first South Island men's singles title at the expense of Armstrong. Last year Hamel beat Armstrong, 21-18, 12-21, 12-21, 21-19, 22-20. This year Armstrong beat Hamel, 21-12, 21-19, 11-21, 21-15.



REPRESENTATIVE CONTESTS AND TEAM TOURNAMENTS

Representative contests now take the form of regional round robin tournaments, both for senior and junior players, and, as a result, players are being involved in keener competition, not only for themselves, but for their Association. Round robin tournaments are also a better economic proposition in relation to travel, hall hire and other incidental expenses.

We are pleased at the number of school children's tournaments being held throughout the country. We note, for instance, that at a tournament held in New Plymouth on 22 August, 1980, approximately 80 entries were received. Events were provided for the under 12, 12-14 and 14-16 years age groups.

Franklin teams are close to setting an all time record for successive wins in the Sutton Shield competition. The annual round robin tournament for the Laurie Sweetman Shield has at least awakened interest amongst the competing associations, but it is necessary that each year, all eligible associations take part, to ensure total competition. Marlborough retained the Perry Shield when they narrowly beat Nelson 5-46. Nelson Juniors took their revenge when they beat Marlborough juniors 23-17, to break Marlborough's 10-year grip on the Angel Shield.

The South Island inter-association teams tournament caters nicely for South Island Associations, both in team matches for men and women and for boys and girls. The system, this year, of establishing winners based on the number of matches won, is not a system followed for other inter-association competitions. The reasons for the introduction of this method of deciding the overall winners has not been explained but, for a comparison basis, matches won gives no indication of how the contests went for each Association.

The Rotorua junior team retained the Hardaker Shield beating Te Puke and Tauranga. This is an annual junior event in the Bay of Plenty/Rotorua areas, which is little known outside the area and yet the shield has been competed for over many years.

In many cases we are relying on a browse through newspaper clippings, which come into our possession, to ascertain detailed results and comments of inter-association contests played throughout the country. This is not good enough and indicates that Associations are not keeping the NZTTA fully informed of their activities.







COACHING REPORT BY MERV. ALLARDYCE, CONVENOR COACHING SUB-COMMITTEE

P.A. Hirst

We were indebted to the English Table Tennis Association for making Peter Hirst available for one month. During his short stay Peter conducted;

- (a) The National Junior Coaching schools.
- (b) Seminars for coaches in Palmerston North and Christchurch.
- (c) The senior training squad in Wellington Stadium.

In addition Peter made his services available at short notice, to conduct a one day seminar for coaches in Auckland.

Players and coaches will be delighted to know that the English T.T. Association has made Peter available for a month in 1981 and they are also prepared to make another coach available in 1982.

National Junior Coaching Schools

To make full use of Peter Hirst's expertise the National Junior Coaching Schools for boys and girls were combined and held in the Auckland Stadium over the Easter period.

In an attempt to give local coaches as much exposure as possible to Peter's methods, selected coaches, representing most of the regions, were invited to participate in the conduct of the schools. As far as can be ascertained both the foregoing can be considered successful. However, in a report the Auckland Association advised of problems in finding billets and they considered the period for billeting, five days, was excessive especially during a long holiday break.

Regional Coaching

1980 saw the introduction of moves to implement suggestions from Peter Hirst for a standardised and co-ordinated coaching scheme.

For coaching purposes New Zealand has been divided into seven regions as follows:-

- Region 1. - Auckland, Franklin, Northland, North Shore and Waitemata.
- Region 2. - Bay of Plenty, East Waikato, Hamilton, Poverty Bay, Rotorua and Thames Valley.
- Region 3. - Bush, Manawatu, Hawkes Bay, North Taranaki, South Taranaki and Wanganui.
- Region 4. - Hutt Valley, Kapiti, Wairarapa and Wellington.
- Region 5. - Marlborough, Nelson and West Coast.

Region 6. - Canterbury, Mid-Canterbury and South Canterbury.

Region 7. - Otago and Southland.

Each region was to appoint a regional committee, consisting of a representative from each member association and a Regional Coach.

The main thrust for 1980 was to centre on:-

1. Each club and association having an official coach or coaches.
2. Association coaching to be on a regular basis with the top players in various categories as determined to participate in coaching at Regional level.
3. Regional coaching conducted on a regular basis in line with the aims as set out by the Regional Committee.

From reports received it would seem that some associations and regions have been more successful than others. The important factor, however, is that a start has been made and it is hoped that the results will encourage further progress in 1981 and subsequent years.

A further progression will be that to qualify for coaching at regional level a player must be a regular participant at regional level to qualify for national level coaching. Finally, a player would need to be in the national squad to qualify for national selection.

Coaching Manual

The manual which was prepared by Mr Dave Cook from notes and observations made during Peter Hirst's visits in 1979 and 1980 will be distributed to coaches in the new year, availability of these manuals will no doubt further encourage the recruitment of more coaches.

We record our appreciation to Dave Cook for preparing the manual.

Miss McCulloch, who is a member of Peter Hirst's team, spent about two months in N.Z. on holiday. During her stay she carried out coaching assignments for several associations which were on her itinerary. Miss McCulloch was well received and we were grateful to her for offering her services.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The following performances should be taken into consideration when deciding the Player of the Year award:

(i) Any outstanding performance in an overseas nation's championships

Barry John Griffiths (Auckland) performed outstandingly in the 1980 Australian national open teams and individual championships. In the boys' team championships, Griffiths won 17 matches and lost 1. Seeded 2nd in the Australian boys' open singles event, Griffiths was beaten in the final by the 1st seed and arch rival Gary Haberl (NSW), 21-16, 10-21, 19-21. In the men's open singles, Griffiths, seeded 11th gave a brilliant performance to reach the final, beating among others, Gary Haberl (NSW) in a match in which he came from behind thus demonstrating fighting qualities. The scores in this five-game match were 21-19, 16-21, 20-22, 21-12, 23-21. Griffiths then scored the biggest upset of the event when he beat the defending titleholder, Bob Tuckett (Victoria) 21-17, 14-21, 21-14, 21-18. In the final Griffiths lost to the experienced Australian international Paul Pinkewich (NSW) 16-21, 14-21, 17-21.

(ii) Any outstanding performance in the New Zealand national open championships or inter-association teams championships.

Griffiths reached the quarter finals of the New Zealand national open championships when he beat the 3rd seed and New Zealand representative, James Morris (Northland) but then lost to Gary Haberl (NSW) 21-15, 15-21, 18-21, 17-21. Griffiths had his revenge when he beat Haberl in the boys under 16 years in a remarkable scoring games being down 14-20 in the last game to take the game and title, 14-21, 21-10, 22-20. He also won four other junior national titles.

(iii) The award should be given for performances over and above ordinary expectations and particularly for those which show strong evidence of fighting qualities.

Griffiths clearly demonstrated these qualities particularly against the brilliant Australian youngster Gary Harbel.

(iv) In addition to these outstanding performances, the players must have maintained a high general level of play through the season.

Barry Griffiths won the men's singles title at the Wellington open championships; he won the boy's under 18 title at the North Island, North Shore and Waitemata open championships and he won the under 16 boys' title at the Auckland open championships.

(v) The youth of any player performing outstandingly shall receive consideration in deciding their right to the award.

Barry John Griffiths was born on 29 February 1964 and at the time of his successes was 16 years old.

The choice of Player of the Year for 1980 and for the second year in succession was obvious to all, and at a special function arranged by the Auckland Association, Barry John Griffiths was presented with the Player of the Year award and memento, by the Minister of Recreation and Sport Hon. A.D. Highet.

History of the Award

Through the generosity of the English Table Tennis Association, the net proceeds of the international contest England v New Zealand at Winchester, England in 1954, amounting to approximately 50 sterling pounds, was donated to the New Zealand Association. Using part of these funds, it was decided to introduce a Player of the Year Award based on a similar presentation conducted by the English Association. A handsome trophy was purchased and the first award was made to R.V. Jackson of Auckland in 1955 for the winning of the New Zealand, North Island and South Island singles titles in the one year in a clear-cut and decisive manner. INTERNATIONAL TOURS AND OTHER OVERSEAS ACTIVITIES

TOUR BY THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

"No matter where they play and no matter who they are - experienced champions or up-and-coming youngsters - it is usually the players from the People's Republic of China who are the centre of attention at a major table tennis tournament."

"The mystique of the Chinese players, derives partly from their proud history in world championships since they first appeared in the late 1950's, and partly from the fact that their champions cover such a range of difference styles of play. Whether you want to see a hitter, a chopper, a pusher, tricky serves or whatever, there is always one in the Chinese team."

The above comments by Doug Stewart, the Australian Table Tennis correspondent, was borne out during the 15-day tour of New Zealand in May/June 1980 by the 10-member delegation from the People's Republic of China.

The Chinese delegation was led by Xi Enting, the 1972-73 world champion, with Lie Yenli, the team secretary/interpreter and Xiao Yangzhong the coach. With an average age of 18, the Chinese team of 4 men and 3 women represented the best young talent from China, specially selected for the South Pacific tour after the holding of national trials in Chinghuandao in

March. Oldest player in the team was 21-year-old Jiang Zilong, who was placed fourth in the trials. Fan Changmao, 17-year-old soldier, the player whose service is looked upon as the most lethal in China, was junior champion in 1979 while Wang Baojun was a member of the winning team at the same championships. The fourth player was Zhu Jianewi, runner-up in national junior championships 1978.

The women's team was even stronger with Tian Yujing ranked first, Jiao Zhimin, third and Li Chunli, fifth at the 1980 junior championships.

The tour was made very attractive by the involvement of Skellerup Industries Ltd and the tour was known as the "Skellerup All Star Series - People's Republic of China versus New Zealand." The New Zealand and Chinese Teams wore Skellerup All Star sport shoes and other equipment supplied by the promoters. In addition, radio advertising, Skellerup All Star signs and banners were also included at the various centres where matches were played. The association with Skellerup Industries Ltd was one of the most successful involvements the NZTTA has had for an international tour and all provincial associations included in the itinerary as well as the NZTTA benefitted from the financial return that resulted.

A most attractive tour programme was published by C.Rex Monigatti, a Wellington Public Relations and Editorial Services. 3000 programmes were printed and, although Associations received a percentage of sales, the selling of the programmes were not vigorously pursued by Associations and the total sales were most disappointing. Mr.Monigatti made an observation that the public obviously attended to watch the table tennis, rather than to read a programme booklet.

The important part played by the Chinese community in the hospitality showered upon the visitors, and the courtesies extended to the team delegation at all hotels where they were accommodated during the stay in New Zealand, added to the success of the tour.

To sum up

In his letter of thanks to the Secretary-General, All China Sports Federation following the conclusion of the tour, the Secretary correctly assessed the atmosphere when he wrote,

"The youthful Chinese Table Tennis team led by Ex Enting and Xiao Yangzhong, were a tremendous success in New Zealand. Their youthful exuberance, their eagerness to learn from new experiences, their resolve to accept New Zealand customs and food, their laughter, fun and punctuality, their co-operation at all times and their display of table tennis skills, made their visit memorable. They were all a credit to the People's Republic of China.

I had the honour to travel with the delegation throughout the tour of New Zealand, and it was one of the most delightful

liaisons I have ever had in my long association with table tennis.

The team party were feted and welcomed by the local Chinese community and table tennis fraternity, wherever they went. They were introduced to Maori customs with traditional singing and feasting. In return the Chinese team members gave us items of Chinese melodies which were a delight to listen to.

The delegation were accorded a Government reception hosted by the Minister of Recreation and Sport, the Hon. D.A. Highet and they were entertained by the Ambassador of the People's Republic of China in New Zealand.

We learnt a lot from watching their table tennis skills. Both the boys and girls were fast around the table, with good control and strong hitting on both sides and their strategy was more purposeful than the New Zealand players, in that they took the initiative whether they were serving or whether they were receiving service. It was obvious that the Chinese players had good coaches to teach them these skills.

You sent us two good leaders in Xi Enting and Xiao Yangzhong and it was clear that the players held them both in great esteem and listened intently to their advice.

Mrs Liu Yenli, the secretary-interpreter, was most efficient. Her understanding of the languages, her travel experiences in looking after groups and her pleasant manner at all times added to the success of the tour. We are most grateful that you included such a capable secretary in the team management."



It is pleasing to record another noteworthy performance by the New Zealand boys and girls teams in the Australian junior interstate teams championships, held at the Kingborough Sports Complex, Kingston, Hobart, Tasmania, 6-12 September, 1980.

In the final placings, the boys team came third after Victoria and Queensland. Commenting, the New Zealand Coach, Paul Escott, said, "a good effort by the boys who came third, although with a little luck, I feel they could have come second or even first, as both their losses were 4-5 and on both occasions, they had their chances."

The girls achieved their best rating with second place to Victoria, the only State to which they lost and again, taking the comments of the New Zealand coach, "overall it was a tremendous performance by our girls,"

The best individual performance came from Barry Griffiths, who won 17 of his 18 matches, losing only to N.Fields of Western Australia, 23-25 in the third game. Barry was well supported by Peter Jackson who won 12 and lost 6. These two players were the main thrust of the boys team.

In her first outing as a New Zealand representative, 15-year-old Kadia Rice made a good impression, winning 15 of her 18 matches. Kadia was well supported by Lynda Dyer (Auckland) making her third trip to Australia as a member of the New Zealand team. Lynda won 13 matches and lost 5.

The New Zealanders acquitted themselves well in the boys and girls singles events, with Barry Griffiths (2nd seed) losing in the final to the brilliant Australian junior, Gary Haberl (NSW) (1st seed), 21-16, 10-21, 19-21.

Kadia Rice was the best of the girls, finally losing to the 1st seed an experienced Australian international, Pam Whitehouse (Queensland), 14-21, 21-15, 17-21.

With the exception of Barry Griffiths, who reached the final of the men's singles, the New Zealanders had a mixture of successes, although it should be noted that, in many cases, the matches lost went to four and five games before a decision was reached.

The outstanding success, of course, was Barry Griffiths, who on his way to the final besetted his Australian rival, Gary Haberl (NSW), 21-19, 16-21, 20-22, 21-12, 23-21; then caused the biggest upset of the tournament by beating the 2nd seed Bob Tuckett (Victoria) 21-17, 14-21, 21-14, 21-18. This win hit the headlines in New Zealand and created great excitement in the New Zealand camp at the championships. Griffiths went on to avenge a defeat at the 1979 Australian championships, by beating G.Thomas (Queensland) in 3 straight games in the semi-final, but was unable to overcome the wily experienced Australian champion, Paul Pinkewich and went down in the final, 16-21, 14-21, 17-21.

All the New Zealand boys, excepting Griffiths, were entered in the men's consolation singles which was open to losers of the first two rounds of the men's singles and all were on the same side of the draw. In the quarter final, Laughton beat Pedley and in the semi-final Jackson beat Laughton and went on to take the final beating Ken Cole (BSW), 19-21, 21-15, 21-16.

The girls also entered the women's consolation singles with the best success going to Kadia Rice who was eliminated in the quarter finals by the eventual winner L.Chisholm (SA), 15-21, 16-21.

The Manager, Mr R.J.Menchi, who with Ron Foster (Hutt Valley) were invited to attend the AGM of the Australian Umpires Association as observers. Two guest speakers addressed the meeting, Mr L.A. Haycraft, a member of the ITTF Rules Committee and Mr Mike Johns the newly appointed Australian Director of Coaching.

Mr Menchi was also given the opportunity of speaking to the members of the ATTA Council on matters of mutual interest to Australia and New Zealand. As a member of the New Zealand Executive Committee, Mr Menchi was able to express the New Zealand viewpoint with authority.

A major decision of the ATTA Council was the decision to change the junior age categories to under 15 and under 17 years as at 31 December of the previous year and to hold a separate junior championships during the May school holidays. For New Zealand to compete in the Australian junior championships, this Australia decision means re-thinking of holding the national junior coaching schools in the May school holidays and selecting teams based on performances of the previous year, with the consequent disadvantage of a long period of table tennis inactivity.

Outfitting: Once again Lane Walker and Rudkin Ltd supplied Adidas track suits as sponsored items and playing gear, shirts, shorts and sox per player at cost. The continued support of Adidas is appreciated.

In his report, the Manager, commented that the team maintained the high standard on and off the table set by their predecessors of 1978 and 1979.

"I felt this team had a great team spirit and it must have been apparent as a number of officials were complimentary on this aspect of the team's performance", said Mr Menchi.

We would like to endorse the Manager's thanks to the Australian Council for allowing New Zealand to have teams competing in the inter-state teams competitions; to the kind people who accepted the New Zealand junior as guests in their homes, and to the Tasmania Table Tennis Association for their efficient running of the Australian Championships and their friendliness and co-operation which made the New Zealand stay in the holiday State, so pleasant.

New Zealand Juniors at the Australian Sub-Junior Championships

New Zealand was represented for the first time at the Australian Sub-Junior championships held at Geelong, Victoria, 18-23 May, 1980. This was an open tournament with events for boys and girls under the age of 16 and 14.

As the Australian Association was only prepared to accept a New Zealand team, and not a local Auckland provincial team as originally proposed, the team was given national endorsement by the national selectors accepting the Auckland Association's

selection of Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson, the top ranked New Zealand boys under 16 years of age, and by selecting Alan Pedley (Franklin) as the third member of the team. The Auckland Association, which was responsible for all the detailed planning, included Guy Palmer, the under 14 champion who was in Melbourne at the time of the championships as a member of the team. The Manager of the team was Bob Lassen and he was assisted by Dave Palmer.

The New Zealand Association accepted that all expenses would be borne by the player's Association or by themselves and that the travel and other arrangements already made by the Auckland Association would be endorsed.

In the team events the New Zealand team beat all States except Victoria to which they recorded a narrow loss of 4-5. As to be expected, Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson were the stars, with Barry playing in every contest, winning every match, eighteen in all and only being extended to three games on two occasions. Peter Jackson played in five contests winning 11 matches and losing 4. Alan Pedley played in four contests winning five and losing seven matches, while Guy Palmer played in three contests, winning 4 and losing five matches.

Team results were - beat Tasmania 6-3, beat West Australia 8-1, beat South Australia 7-2, lost to Victoria 4-5, beat New South Wales 6-3 and beat Queensland 7-2.

Final team placings were: 1 Victoria, 2 NEW ZEALAND, 3 New South Wales, 4 Queensland, 5 South Australia, 6 Tasmania and 7 West Australia.

In the individual events, Barry Griffiths beat Peter Jackson (NZ) in the second round, then beat Guy Palmer (NZ) in the third round and he went on to meet Gary Haberl (NSW) in the semi-final in yet another encounter between two brilliant juniors of equal ability. The 3-game match was exciting with each player demonstrating power, speed, tactics and tremendous fighting strength as each one, at some stage in the match, came from behind to draw level or to take a lead. The score in favour of the Australian, 21-19, 21-23, 22-20 indicates how evenly matched the two players were.

New Zealand was destined not to win any individual title when Griffiths and Jackson, as our last hope, were beaten in the final of the boys doubles by Haberl and Dongate, 14-21, 18-21.

Another New Zealand Junior team tours Australia

An Auckland under 15 years team toured New South Wales 27 July - 4 August, 1980. The team comprised Raymond Gin, Trevor Coad, Robert Hossen and Annmaree Hogarty. The Manager was Jim Coad. It was a tour organised by the New South Wales Country Table Tennis League and its main purpose was to give the players plenty of table tennis, representative play and overseas competition. The Manager reported that the organisation was good, plenty of time being available during the day for shopping etc, with contests

every night, culminating in the 1980 Hiberian A.C.T. Open Table Tennis Championships at Canberra on 2/3 August. "Looking back", said Mr Coad, "the tour was a most successful one. We all enjoyed the experience of it and, in particular, meeting and getting to know many of the officials and players over there."

Visit of delegation from Mie Prefecture, Japan: The Auckland Association continued their rapport with the Mie Prefecture by inviting a delegation of 11 made up of players and coaches to compete at the 1980 Air New Zealand Auckland Open Championships held at Auckland on 16/17 August, 1980.

The delegation was led by ^{Kohji Yoneda} Kyoji Murayama Chief Director, Mie Prefecture Table Tennis Association. The two coaches were Kohji Yoneda, and Tadahiko Sakabe. The players were Men: Masahiro Satoh, Tomomi Maeji, Akira Murayama, Motoyuki Kitagawa; Women: Kazuko Itoh and Akiko Hosokawa; Boys: Kazuhiro Kinoshita and Yukiyoshi Mitana. ^{F. Shimada}

The Japanese added sparkle to the Auckland Open and gave the New Zealanders an opportunity to shine with Richard Lee winning the singles title beating M. Satoh, the Mie Champion, 12-11, 21-11, 21-19, 21-13 and with James Morris took the men's doubles title beating Satoh and Maeji in the final, 21-18, 21-18, 22-20.

The Japanese took the women's singles title with Itoh, winner of five world titles in 1958, 61 and 63 and remembers as Kazuko Yamaizumi when she toured NZ with the then world champion Matsuaki in 1960, dominating the event and having little difficulty in beating Mary Cannon in the final, 21-7, 21-8, 21-9. Combining with Hosokawa, Mrs Itoh completed a good double beating Christine Lee and Ann Nobel in the women's doubles final 21-19, 21-14, 21-8.

Griffiths and Mary Cannon surprised in the mixed doubles when they beat the more fancied pair, Satoh and Itoh in the semi-finals, 23-21, 21-10, 7-21, 16-21, 21-15, and in spite of a gallant effort were unable to repeat the effort in the final against Maejo and Hosokawa to whom they lost 14-11, 21-18, 22-20, 16-21, 22-20.

Prior to competing at the Auckland Open the delegation visited Whangarei and after the Auckland open saw the sights of Rotorua.

NSW Men's team tour of New Zealand: The Auckland Association organised a 21 day tour of the North Island by a men's representative team from New South Wales.

The five-man team competed at the Air New Zealand Auckland open championships, following which they played the Auckland representative team, a contest versus Hamilton at Hamilton, sightseeing in Rotorua and Taupo, on to Wellington to compete in the ¹⁹⁸⁰ ~~Yasaka~~ Wellington open championships and finally competing in the New Zealand national open championships at Taita. The visiting team comprised Peter Zantis, Stephen Peden, Julian Goldenberg (Captain), Tony Campbell and Ken Ryan.

NZ Games: The NZTTA has accepted responsibility for the table tennis section of the NZ Summer Games. The table tennis

tournament is being conducted by the Auckland Association and will be held in the Air New Zealand Auckland Stadium, 24-28 January, 1984. Six nations, China, Japan, Australia, Indonesia, Canada, and New Zealand, will be competing for team and individual honours.

The New Zealand team will be:

Men: R.E.Lee (Auckland) (Captain), M.R.Temperley (North Shore) and S.G.Armstrong (Canterbury). *B.Griffiths*

Women: Misses J.G.Morris (Canterbury) (Captain), A.M.Brackenridge (Auckland), D.J.Looms (Marlborough) and S.J.Palmer (Auckland).

COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Because of the security aspects, the Irish Table Tennis Association found that many Commonwealth countries were not prepared to accept Belfast as a suitable venue for the 1981 Commonwealth Championships. As a result the option to hold the championships in Belfast was withdrawn.

After endeavouring to interest other countries such as Hong Kong and India to take up the option, it was found that neither country was complimentary to travel to Yugoslavia for the World Championships, and as a consequent the 1981 Commonwealth Championships are not being held.

With the 1983 World Championships to be held in Japan, the obvious venue to hold the next Commonwealth Championships, because of its geographical placing to Japan, is Hong Kong. It is hoped that a Hong Kong venue can be confirmed say in 1981, to ensure the championships being held.

36th World Table Tennis Championships

Although at one stage, it seemed unlikely that New Zealand would be represented at the 36th World Table Tennis Championships to be held in Novi Sad, Yugoslavia, because of the high costs of travel and accommodation, which our financial resources could not absorb, the position changed somewhat, when players, canvassed as to their availability, were prepared to pay a larger personal contribution and as a result of negotiations with the Australian Association, an attractive travel package deal was arranged which included the New Zealand team party travelling with the Australians.

The New Zealand selectors named the following players as the New Zealand team to compete at the World Championships

Men: R.E.Lee (Auckland) (Captain), B.J.Griffiths (Auckland) and M.R. Temperley (North Shore)

Two non-travelling reserves were named, G.B.Lassen (Auckland) to take the place of R.E.Lee and S.G.Armstrong (Canterbury) to take the place of either B.J.Griffiths or M.R.Temperley.

Women: Misses J.G.Morris (Canterbury) (Captain) and S.J.Palmer (Auckland) Miss Kadia Rice (Bay of Plenty), originally named as

the non-travelling reserve, was added to the team party on the understanding that she would meet the payment of all travel and accommodation costs not included in the free hospitality provided by the Yugoslavia Organising Committee.

From the two nominees submitted by Association, Mr K.L.Pointon was appointed Manager of the team. As Mr Pointon was Manager of the previous New Zealand team that competed at the 1979 World Championships, the experience gained will stand him in good stead for his second appointment as Manager.

Mr K.L.Pointon was also named as the New Zealand delegate to attend the ITTF Biennial Congress.

INTERNATIONAL TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

Mr A.R.Harding a member of the ITTF Council attended a meeting of the Council, held in Cardiff, Wales, on 28-30 May, 1980.

Mr K.C.Wilkinson was nominated by New Zealand and supported by Australia, for the position of Vice-President (Oceania Continent) of the International Table Tennis Federation. The appointment for 1981/83 will be ratified at the biennial general meeting of the Federation at Novi Sad, Yugoslavia in April, 1981. Mr Wilkinson is currently the President of the Oceania Table Tennis Federation.

For the position of Council Member which rotates, between Australia and New Zealand, the Australian nominee for 1981-83 is Mr L.A.Haycraft.

OCEANIA FEDERATION CHAMPIONSHIPS

It seems likely from negotiations taking place that the 2nd Oceania Federation Championships will be held in Suva, Fiji, late 1982. It is expected that New Zealand will send teams, particularly as the winner of the men's singles event, is an automatic choice to compete in the World Cup tournament, a prestige tournament which features the champions of the various continental regions as well as selected players from the top placings of the world rankings.

STATUS OF PLAYERS

It is now a rule of the International Table Tennis Federation that each Association shall compile and maintain a register of its players who are classified as professional, and shall make the register available for inspection by the ITTF on request.

Report on 1980 National Lottery by S.F.Miller (Organizer)

Total sales in the 1980 National lottery were 67,658 tickets,

about 5,000 tickets down on last year's sales but still a fine result. Special mention must be made of the efforts of Northland and West Coast associations both of which sold well in excess of their initial allocations.

On the basis of guarantees, the New Zealand association was set to receive \$14,457-90, which, after costs of \$7,350-29, leaves a profit of \$7,109-61. A major contribution to this came from success in arranging for ATLANTIC & PACIFIC TRAVEL INTERNATIONAL LTD to sponsor the ticket printing which cost almost \$600. However, this brought its administrative problems with the tie of having first and second prizes being travel without a cash option.

At the direction of the AGM the initial ticket allocation was based on affiliation fees for 1980. The table at the end of this report sets out this allocation and tickets taken along with details of sales.

Clearly, a number of associations are not making a fair contribution by only accepting a low number of tickets in comparison with what would seem to be their fair share.

Associations should think hard to find an equitable system for the future. It is important to realise that, without a reasonable contribution to the New Zealand Association, and one that keeps pace with rising costs, either the money will need to be found another way or the support for some activities will diminish.

UMPILING By Alf Richards, Convenor NZTTA Umpires Committee

Last year the sub-committee commenced the task of restructuring national umpiring on the agreed basis of a three-tiered system - Provincial, National and International.

The first step was the establishment of a satisfactory format for Provincial Umpires, and the following action was taken:

- A list of active umpires was compiled and circulated to all Associations.
- A register of local instructors (being existing senior umpires) was set up - one for each Association where possible. These are to be responsible for conducting practical examinations and acting as recruiting and liaison officers.
- A brochure containing notes for the guidance of local instructors was printed and distributed.
- The New Zealand written examination for umpires was completely revised along similar lines to the English T.T.A. examination.
- A sponsor was obtained for the printing of the International Table Tennis laws in poster form. (These have now been printed).

Plans for the current year include:-

- (1) Production of Provincial Umpires Certificates.
- (2) Publication of a newsletter for umpires.
- (3) Designing and printing a Recruiting Poster for Club Rooms (to be sponsored).
- (4) Production of a leaflet promoting table tennis, with a special section on umpires (to be sponsored).
- (5) Promotion of umpiring in other ways e.g. the presentation of certificates and badges to those who have qualified, at major tournaments, special reference in addresses at coaching schools and tournaments, and in literature issued

- by clubs and associations.
- (6) Preparation for the launching of a National Umpire scheme in 1982.

Provincial Umpires: Three candidates were successful in passing the examinations to qualify as provincial umpires while two candidates failed to pass the theory examination. The provincial umpires are:

P.R.Myers (Fiji) - now a resident in Australia
H.Rennie (Otago)
R.P.McCully (East Waikato)

INTERNATIONAL UMPIRES: The first international Umpires Examination in New Zealand was conducted during the year, and all four candidates were successful:- Messrs. K.L.Pointon, G.V.Wilkinson, K.A.Fraser and I.L.Houghton.

International certificates and lapel badges were presented to the Umpires during the national week activities at Taita.

SPONSORSHIP AND GRANTS

Ministry of Recreation and Sport

We acknowledge with thanks the financial assistance approved by the Minister of Recreation and Sport for national projects for 1980/81. The Minister approved the following subsidies totalling \$13,240 and comprising:

- (i) a subsidy of \$4,000 on a 2 : 1 basis towards a \$5,240 administration grant;
- (ii) a subsidy of \$4,000 on a 2 : 1 basis towards the appointment of a contracted coach;
- (iii) a subsidy of \$3,000 on a 2 : 1 basis towards internal coaching; and
- (iv) a subsidy of \$1,000 on a 1 : 1 basis towards the provision of training material for umpires.

It should also be noted that the NZTTA had already received a subsidy of \$845 earlier this year towards a delegate's fare to the International Federation meeting held in Wales.

The subsidies approved did not include a grant towards the travel and accommodation of the New Zealand Junior teams to Australia which could be due to the fact that assistance for overseas is limited to one tour every two years.

The National Junior Coaching Schools for boys and girls were sponsored by the manufacturers of the adopted table tennis ball and other NITTAKU table tennis equipment. A cash donation of \$1,500 together with a supply of balls for the national championships and coaching schools were received from the Wellington agents, John Vaughan & Company Limited. We appreciate the support being received from the Nippon Takkyu Company Limited of Japan through their New Zealand agents.

FINANCIAL - Report by Treasurer R.J.Lynn ACA

The year under review saw activities maintained on the same scale as last year. Expenses were incurred over the same area as for 1979 but felt the effect of increased prices prevalent.

Two coaching schools and two coaching seminars held in conjunction with the second visit of the English coach, Peter Hirst, and the sending of a New Zealand Junior Team to Australia were the main events of the season involving considerable expenditure. The coaching was made possible by way of a financial grant of \$7,500 received from the Government's Recreation and Sports programme.

The income shown in the revenue account is the total income of the Association from all sources within New Zealand. The expenses are also the total operating expenses of the Association for the year. Following on from previous years, a transfer is shown, in the second part of the expenditure section, being made to the Overseas Tour Fund.

Items that appear in the Statement of Income and Expenditure, which need special reference, are:-

(i) Chinese Tour of New Zealand

Proceeds from sponsorship, guarantees for test and provincial matches, and TV rights enabled the Association to cover all internal travel and accommodation costs incurred throughout the country. Surplus proceeds of \$2,335 have enabled a greater amount to be made available for transfer to the Overseas Tour Fund.

(ii) Recovery Coaching Costs 1979

This represents the reduction in the deposit required by Air New Zealand for travel within New Zealand. Payment of the deposit was charged against coaching in 1979.

(iii) Delegate's Expenses

\$727 is made up of an air fare grant of \$650 made to the delegate by the executive committee, and \$77 expenses incurred by the delegate in preparation for overseas travel.

(iv) Championships Expenses

Formerly known as Tournament Play Committee, these consist of liaison officers' travel expenses to the three main championships held - NZ, N.I. and S.I., together with the cost of printing results and other sheets for these championships where the NZ Association is responsible.

(v) NZ Junior Tour of Australia

Although members of the team contributed \$2,500 towards the cost of the tour, the Association still faced a net cost of \$4,722. No grant could be obtained from Recreation and Sports, as the policy is for a grant to be made for overseas travel every second year.

The National Lottery was, despite problems with basic allocations, very successful overall. Provincial Associations benefited by \$19,984 while the New Zealand Association's return was \$7,106, boosted by sponsorship received for the printing of the tickets.

The net financial position decreased by \$2,378 as at 31 October, 1980. The short term deposit of \$12,000 with our bankers, Bank of New South Wales, was redeemed. \$6,000 was placed on deposit with Marac Ltd, in return for sponsorship of players' fixture lists in 1981. No grants have been received in advance this year.

The future will see investigations being made of the feasibility to engage a full time coach, and to expand our overseas tour programme. To meet the costs of these additional activities and administration, increases in affiliation fees, increases in contributions from players, and more monies from sponsorship will need to be sought.

OBITUARY

It is with sadness that we record the deaths of Alan McCallum and Bill Jopson.

ALAN BRUCE MCCALLUM had a long association with table tennis both as a provincial leader in the Canterbury Association and as a prominent administrator of the New Zealand Association. In two separate terms, he was President of the New Zealand Association; he served a combined total of 20 years as President of the Canterbury Association; he was a life member of both the provincial and national associations; a South Island selector for 10 years and manager of the New Zealand team that competed at the Seapatt tournament in Melbourne 1968.

Alan was a notable umpire on the lawn tennis courts and was a past president of the Canterbury branch of the umpires association. Alan McCallum died at the Princess Margaret Hospital, Christchurch on 10 September, 1980 at the age of 65. With his passing, Table Tennis has lost a grand sportsman and a prominent administrator.

After a short, but terminal illness, WILLIAM STEPHEN RUSH JOPSON, 77, passed away peacefully at the Dunedin Hospital on 6 November, 1980. Bill Jopson was a member of the New Zealand Executive Committee for 13 years, 1959/71, but it was as chairman of the management committee of the Wellington Association, 1959/63 that he was best remembered. Bill worked hard for the sport, he was dependable, reliable and always ready to support any project or to assist with the promotion of championships or representative contests.

Employed by the City Council as a traffic officer in Wellington he assisted more erring motorists with good counselling than by issuing "tickets". He was a keen promoter of social activities, had a variety of interests which led to a wide circle of friends and because of this involvement he became an identity of Wellington.

Bill Jopson had personality and will be missed by many friends.
