

TO ALL MEMBERS

The executive committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration, the 49th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, covering the activities of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association, Incorporated, during the year ended 31 October, 1981.

MEMBERSHIP

It is usual to open the Annual Report with details of membership because the numbers indicate the strength and growth of the national organisation. The numbers are also a means of comparing the interest in table tennis with that of other sports.

At the 31 October, 1982, the date when the financial year ended, there were seven Associations that had not supplied figures. There was difficulty in understanding the Canterbury return because some of its clubs were not prepared to submit figures, in protest at the \$1 coaching levy on all affiliation players as returned for the 1982 season which was an authorisation of the delegates attending the 1982 NZ Annual General Meeting.

Rather than hold up the typing of this report while awaiting late returns, the membership statistics will now appear near the end of this report. Why is it that each year there is a slow reaction to submitting a membership return? Is it because Associations themselves have a slow reaction from their clubs to submit figures?

But should not all club subscriptions be paid to the local Association by, say 30 June each year and a chase-up made of those clubs who become unaffiliated by non-payment and, if necessary, to invoke penalty clauses. In effect, should not every Association have the confirmed number of clubs and total club membership by say 30 June each year?

So why the difficulty in submitting a membership return to the NZTTA by say the end of August? Is it the fear that the more numbers supplied by Associations, the more they have to pay to the NZTTA? Well let us examine that statement for it is not a fear it is a fact.

It has been explained time and time again that until table tennis changes its basis of subscriptions to one of a payment by each club member, called a capitation fee, successfully exploited by practically every other sport, table tennis will continue to be the cinderella sport.

We could go further and say that until each club and Association sets its membership fee more realistically in terms of inflation and needs, table tennis will slip backwards.

The theme can also be put in another way. Unless the finances of the national organisation is buoyant and annual income is steady and assured, the fall away in club membership will continue.

This may sound obscure but think carefully. If the NZTTA is to engage a full time international coach, if we are to encourage more coaching seminars and schools, if we are to send our elite players to compete regularly on the

overseas circuits, if we are to enjoy visits from overseas international teams or to send our best juniors to the Australian championships each year, and by doing all those things, raise the general standard and make the sport more interesting and rewarding to the club member, then there has to be more funds in the national kitty.

Fresh thinking is required about subscriptions, beginning with the club members paying at least three times the present club fee; for Associations to receive sufficient revenue from a source of capitation fee to fund their own activities and for the national organisation to receive sufficient revenue from a similar source of capitation fee to fund the activities mentioned.

It is simply economics which seems to elude table tennis economists that the user must pay.

SNIPPETS

**** Auckland Stadium: The new upstairs lounge at the Air New Zealand Table Tennis Stadium in Auckland, was opened on Friday 9 July 1982 just immediately before the North Island Championships. The Minister of Recreation & Sport, Mr Alan Highet, officially opened the lounge and other speakers included John Lelliott, speaking on behalf of the NZ Table Tennis Association, and Dick Rassie, President of the Auckland Association.

Also present at this function was the Mayor of Auckland, Colin Kay and representatives from Auckland's major sponsors, Metropolitan Life and Air New Zealand. Thanks was extended to the New Zealand Insurance for their contribution to the speedy reconstruction of the Stadium, following the fire on 25 October, 1981, which caused over \$100,000 damage.

The new lounge features twelve large windows, overlooking the playing area, most of which measure 1.68m x 1.07m (5½ft x 3½ft). This provides for excellent spectator viewing and visitors to the North Island Championships were impressed. The new upstairs area also provides a new large Canteen, men's and women's toilets, a bar and a soft drink dispensing area.

The extensions to the Stadium cost the Auckland Association \$65,000 and the Stadium is now insured at replacement value of \$641,000.

**** Inter-School Competitions: The Auckland Association had further large increases in its inter-school competitions with 153 school teams entered in the Winter League (June-August). This compares with 115 teams last year and 50 teams in 1980.

**** Otago Association Celebrates 50th Jubilee: On the weekend of July 9-10, 1982, the Otago Association celebrated its 50th Jubilee - in conjunction with the 1982 Otago Open Championships. The weekend comprised a get together on the Friday evening and a dinner on the Saturday evening, at which six-times New Zealand champion, Russell Algie was guest speaker. Nearly 120 attended the dinner, with former Otago players coming from all over New Zealand for the occasion.

A mini-museum was erected at the Otago Stadium, showcasing photos from throughout the 50 years plus various mementos and souvenirs and items of ancient table tennis equipment.

The local media gave the Jubilee every assistance, and a window in Dunedin's leading department store, Arthur Barnetts was given over to the Jubilee for an entire week preceding the celebrations. Dominion Breweries assisted the Jubilee with sponsorship of \$300. The Otago Association also produced a 48-page historical booklet, edited by Barrie Kendall, and this invaluable and comprehensive record of achievements on and off the table in Otago's first 50 years was one of the Jubilee's special successes.

The booklet noted in its leading article that the two outstanding eras in Otago table tennis have come roughly every 15-16 years - which means that another one is just about ready to break. With Otago's current renaissance in junior ranks under coach Martin Duffy, where numbers have never been higher, the Otago Association is justifiably confident that era number three is close to hand.

**** Over 100 Entries for a School Tournament: The North Taranaki Association conducted a tournament for school pupils for which they received over 100 entries from players under 17 years of age who do not play inter-club. This is proof and could be typical of other Associations that there is no dearth of youngsters willing to play table tennis if only we had the organisers and people willing to control the activities.

NEW ZEALAND JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

(a) Inter-Association Team Contests:

A total of 23 boys' and 15 girls' teams in the under 18 years age group and 17 boys' and 14 girls' teams in the under 15 age group competed for the junior inter-association teams honours in the respective grades. A late entry from the Poverty Bay Association for a boys' team in the under 18 and under 15 team events was not accepted. Last year there were 39 teams in the under 18 group and 37 in the under 15 section.

The team contests were conducted by the Wanganui Association at the Wanganui Sports Stadium 27/28 August, 1982.

Spearheaded by the top New Zealand juniors, Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson and well supported by the NZ junior representatives, Guy Palmer and Raymond Gin, the Auckland boys swept all before them, winning by the maximum possible in all contests to win the premier grade in the under 18 years competition. It was a bulldozing exercise for this mighty Auckland team.

In the "B" grade, Wellington, led by Robert Kerr, the 1982 NZ junior representative, also showed strength and the final results showed them to be in a class of their own compared with the other teams in the grade. Hamilton took out the girls' "A" grade unbeaten but recording three close 6-5 victories over Hutt Valley, Canterbury and Auckland. The presence of the two national representatives, Jane Bevan and Toni Piraudeau had an influence on the results.

There was a good tussel between Canterbury, Northland and Wellington for the under 15 boys' "A" grade title. Canterbury held on getting the nod in the 6-5 victories over Northland and Wellington to give them the 1st place victory.

Similar narrow wins by Auckland over Hutt Valley and Wellington in the girls' under 15 "A" grade saw Auckland emerge unbeaten. In the battle for second place, Hutt Valley lost to Northland 5-6 but beat Wellington 7-4 whereas Wellington beat Northland 7-4. On a count back of matches between the two teams, Hutt Valley scraped through by the odd match.

(b) NZ JUNIOR INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Auckland* Barry Griffiths dominated the under 18 events, being untroubled to win the singles, the doubles, pairing with the losing singles finalist, Peter Jackson, and the mixed with the NZ representative Kadia Rice who also took the girls' singles. Later in the senior section Griffiths was also to win the three open events, singles, doubles and mixed to make a clean sweep in the six main individual events. A truly remarkable achievement.

The Australian juniors were to fore in the under 16 events with the young teenager from NSW, Andrea Campbell outstanding. Andrea came to the NZ championships as the NSW women's open singles champion, as well as the winner of the NSW junior and the under 21 titles. Her potential for Australia is most exciting.

Another Australian, Matthew Walker, with his over the table loop style of play, was too strong for Nigel Kruse (Auckland) in the final winning 21-12, 21-12. With Andrea Campbell in the mixed, the Australians carried too many guns for Gary Traill and Delwyn Houlihan (Northland) in the final.

In a similar manner to the other age group events, Murray Traill (Northland) dominated the under 14 section recording wins in the singles, the doubles with his brother Gary, and the mixed with Eileen Hoete (Auckland). Tanya McAvinue (Manawatu) scored a good win over the selected NZ representative, Eileen Hoete to take the girls singles and then combined with Yvonne Cuthbert (Hutt Valley) to win the girls doubles.

11 year old Maxine Goldie became the first table tennis player of any age from the West Coast to win a New Zealand title when in a close final she beat Susan Cuthbert (Hutt Valley) to win the girls singles under 12 years title. Maxine won 18-21, 22-20, 21-17.

(c) ASSOCIATION AWARD - BILL HURREY CUP

The award to the Association whose players achieved the most successes in the finals of the junior individual events went to the Auckland Association, through the efforts of Barry Griffiths, Peter Jackson and Eileen Hoete who scored maximum points for the events in which they featured.

Although Australian players overall scored more points than Auckland players, mainly because of their domination of the under 16 years events, the Australian Association was not eligible to compete for the award.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the junior events, under 18 and under 16 years, with doubles partners sharing the points and 2 points for the cadet events (under 14 and under 12 years) with doubles partners sharing the points.

The final assessment for the 1982 award were:-

Fresh from their successes in the junior team and individual championships, Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson, strongly supported by the ex NZ representatives, Richard Lee and Graham Lassen, led the Auckland men's team to its seventh consecutive victory for the Kean Challenge Shield. The only close encounter was against Franklin, who was still in with a chance at 4-all but, when Auckland applied the pressure and Barry Griffiths beat Geoff Rau 21-13, 21-10, Auckland took an unassailable lead 6-4.

While the Auckland men were setting more records, Christine Lee, Shelley Palmer, Angela Brackenridge and Christine Prendergast were doing even better. The Auckland women's team was untroubled to win each contest, closing off when a victory result was achieved except in the case of North Taranaki who Auckland beat 9-2, and for the eighth time in succession, took the Teagle Shield, the premier title for women's teams competition.

Auckland, therefore, retained both the men's and women's "A" grade title and, adding their success in winning the boys' under 18 team shield, it is clear that Auckland is the stronghold of New Zealand table tennis. No doubt more attention will be given to improving the lot of the Auckland girls' under 18 so that one year sometime Auckland will scoop the pool, men, women, boys and girls.

After a close call with Hamilton, Wellington won the men's "B" grade, but was unable to topple Northland, the bottom team of the "A" grade in the promotion-relegation contest losing 5-6 and thus remaining in the "B" grade.

Kapiti moved up the scale at Wanganui's expense and will be competing in the higher grade next year. The Radford brothers, Tony and Michael led the victory attack.

In the women's competition, North Taranaki slipped back to "B" grade when they were beaten by North Shore 6-1 win in the promotion/relegation series.

Through sickness Marlborough had to default in their schedule contests with Hamilton and Manawatu. Marlborough could not field a team against Bay of Plenty and forfeited their "B" grade status.

Twenty-four men's teams (27 last year) and 20 women's teams (23) competed for the various team honours at the Wanganui Sports Stadium 31 August/1 September. A late entry of a men's team from the Poverty Bay Association was not accepted.

VICTOR BARNA DUNLOP CUPS AWARDS

In their report on the judging of the 1982 Victor Barna Dunlop Cups awards, the panel of judges, John Howells, Jan Purvis and Elsie Spooner brought to notice a number of aspects which call for attention by the NZ Association. The competition has been allowed to meander on for 32 years without making allowance to explain the purpose of the award to a new generation of players who have little idea of what it is all about.

For instance the judges commented, quote, "The disappointing feature of this year's competition was that many teams (particularly in lower grades) were not really familiar with finer points of Barna Cup judging. All the members of the judging panel were frequently asked questions about what things were actually being judged. We felt that in general, this year too little emphasis had been placed on the prestige of the Barna Cup. Either coaches were unaware of, or disinterested in winning the cup, and as a result many points may have been unwittingly lost. (A number of teams reported not receiving any information from the Associations)", unquote.

The judges also commented that without a knowledge of team colours and uniform it was difficult to decide points under the heading of 'Appearance'. It is intended to update the register of Association's colours and uniforms by asking all Associations to complete a standard form which will give the information required.

We wish to thank the judges for the time spent in watching the teams and assessing points. Their constructive report and comments has highlighted administration weakness and steps will be taken to bring greater awareness of the competition to Associations, players and team officials.

Congratulations to the Waitemata men's team and the Southland women's team who won the respective competitions and had their names engraved on the cups for the first time.

HISTORY OF THE COMPETITION

During his tour of New Zealand in 1949, accompanied by Richard Bergmann, Victor Barna offered a trophy for the promotion of "inter-town competition" on a knock-out basis, or such other promotion of the sport as the New Zealand Executive Committee thought fit.

The trophy was received in 1950 through the courtesy of Dunlop Sports (N.Z.) Ltd, who requested that the trophy be known as the "Victor Barna Dunlop Cup".

The New Zealand Executive Committee decided that the cup shall be awarded annually to the Association whose team or teams, competing in the Inter-Association Teams Championships, excel in play, in sportsmanship, appearance team spirit and punctuality. At first it was decided that the award shall be won by an Association and not by any one team of that Association, in the belief that the award would be an incentive to all Associations to maintain better discipline and foster stronger team spirit among all its players. However, difficulty arose when some Associations had only one team competing, while others had two, and after the first two years of competition, the rules were amended to provide for each team to be considered on its own merits. In 1965, the rules were further amended to provide for two separate competitions, one for men's teams and one for women's teams and again through the courtesy of Dunlop Sports (N.Z.) Ltd, a second identical cup was presented.

(b) NEW ZEALAND NATIONAL OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The sponsored Suzuki 1982 NZ championships were successfully conducted by the Wanganui Association at the Wanganui Sports Stadium on 2/4 September, 1982.

The Tournament Manager was Arthur Watson and the Referee, Mary Broadbent. In their sphere of control, both tournament officials did a good job and much of the success of the championships was due to their management skills.

The championships attracted a number of Australians who added interest to the events in which they participated. Some of the players have been coming regularly to the NZ championships and we are delighted to have them.

For the first time, 'under 21 years singles' were added to the programme. This was a new event restricted to competitors not eligible to play in the junior championships and attracted 25 in the men's singles and 7 in the women's singles.

The championships were a personal triumph for 18-year-old Barry Griffiths who won his first NZ men's singles title beating Auckland team mate, Peter Jackson in the final. Barry then went on to pair with Jackson to upset the titleholders, Morris and Lee to win the men's doubles and made a clean sweep when he took the mixed doubles title with Angela Brackenridge. As Griffiths had previously won the three titles in the under 18 years age group, he set a record never before achieved by a player of winning the maximum six titles, singles, doubles and mixed in the open and under 18 age group events at the same NZ championships. This effort was a personal best for Griffiths which should remain unchallenged in the record books for a long time.

Shelley Palmer took her second national singles title when she beat Angela Brackenridge in the women's final. Both players attacked throughout but Palmer had better control. Angela had previously caused the upset of the championships by toppling the No. 2 seed, Christine Lee in the semi final, 21-13, 21-17, 19-21, 12-21, 21-13. This was the third time the Angela Brackenridge has been a NZ losing singles finalist. In 1978 she was beaten by Jan Morris, -24, 23, 14, -17, -6; in 1980 again by Morris, -12, 23, -17, -17 and in 1982 by Shelley Palmer, -24, 14, -19, -26.

In his report on the conduct of the championships, Ron Menchi the NZ liaison officer wrote, quote, "In conclusion, I must congratulate Wanganui on running a successful tournament. The "knockers" came fearing the worst but finally had to concede that this was a fine effort. Well done Wanganui. The body of 1974 has been well and truly buried!", unquote.

ASSOCIATION AWARD

ARTHUR MEACHEN MEMORIAL CUP

The Arthur Meachen Memorial Cup, which is awarded to the Association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the open and senior age group events at the NZ championships, was won by the Auckland Association for the third year in succession.

With Auckland players featuring in all of the five open finals, and, indeed, only Canterbury Jan Morris stopping them from obtaining the maximum possible assessment for the open singles, doubles and mixed, together with three players winning age group titles, the final points scored by the Auckland Association were nearly five times more than the next best.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the open events, with doubles partners sharing the points and 2 points for the age group events again with doubles partners sharing the points.

INTER-ISLAND CONTESTS

The inter-island contests were a non-event! A weak South Island men's team had no chance against a North Island team fielding the leading NZ representative players including the talented juniors Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson, the latter earning his first North Island cap. Only one match went to three games and there were four games in which the South Island player did not reach double figures. The average score in each game was assessed at 21-14 in favour of the North Island player.

The South Island women did better in that four matches went to three games, only two games were under double figures and the average score for each game was 21-17 in favour of the North Island player.

John Lelliott, the NZ liaison officer reporting on the contest, commented that there was a very poor turn out of spectators and very little interest in the contest which was probably because it was very one-sided with the North Island men winning 12-0 and the women 11-1.

Mr Lelliott again raised the suggestion that serious consideration may have to be given to making it a North vs South contest with the southern part of the North Island being included in the "South" to equalise the number of Associations from which the selections could be made.

The records show that in the men's section, the North Island team has won 31 and the South Island 2. In the women's section, the North Island team has won 25 and the South Island 3.

NORTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Malcolm Temperley (North Shore) took his first North Island men's singles title when he beat Graham Lassen in the quarter finals, Barry Griffiths in the semi and James Morris in the final, -17, 12, 16, 16.

It was a particularly good win against Griffiths for Temperley was two down with scores of -6 and -16 before settling down to take the next three and the match, 12, 17, 14.

Barry Griffiths had a good tournament, demonstrating his class in the junior section being untroubled to win the singles, doubles and mixed in the under 18 years age group. But the men's singles crown still eludes him. Christine Lee, a winner in 1975 when she toured New Zealand as Christine Little, a member of the Australian 2-women team, again had her name engraved as winner of the women's singles in 1982 when she beat Shelley Palmer (Auckland) in the final, 18, -19, 20, 17.

Shelley Palmer had previously disposed of the New Zealand champion, Jan Morris (Canterbury) in the semi final, 19, -14, 18, 21. While Angela Brackenridge has still to etch her name as a singles winner of the one of the three national championships, she continues to record her name as a partner in winning doubles combinations. Once more, with Jan Morris (Canterbury), she won the women's doubles title to add to their successes in 1976/77/78.

North Island Championships (Cont'd)

The championships attracted 722 entries with players coming from all parts of the country to give the championships quality and prestige. Splendid entries in the junior age groups added to the interest.

The championships were conducted by the Auckland Association and held at the Auckland stadium on 9/11 July, 1982.

The Auckland Association took the opportunity of having the new lounge/cafe area officially opened by the Minister of Recreation and Sport, Hon. D.A. Highet. The glassed-in new lounge overlooking the playing area enables players and spectators to watch the play and keep a check on the semaphore board for "next on".

In his report on the conduct of the tournament, John Lelliott, the NZ Association's representative, wrote, quote, "The tournament was very successful being held in what can only be described as the best stadium in New Zealand. The atmosphere was good and the players behaviour was generally of a good standard. The Auckland Association provided a good team to run the tournament under the control of tournament manager, David Jackson and referee Ivan Moffat and they must be congratulated on working non-stop through a long week-end," unquote.


The Tournament Manager was Jim Wilson, the Assistant Manager, Jim Steedman and the referee Barry Kendall.



With no sponsorship forthcoming, the high travel costs made it impracticable to hold a New Zealand final for the Intermediate/Primary School winners.

REPORT OF COACHING SUB-COMMITTEE 1982

Coaching

In 1980, when the English Table Tennis Association agreed to make Peter Hirst available in 1981 they made it clear that if we required a coach in 1982 they would not be able to release Peter again. The replacement coach was David Fairholm and the many table tennis players and administrators who had the pleasure of meeting and working with him were very impressed with his ability and friendliness.

We record our gratitude to David for a job well done and to the English Table Tennis Association for making him available.

During his short stay in New Zealand David:

- 1) Conducted three seminars for coaches in Auckland, Christchurch and Masterton;
- 2) Conducted an Advanced coaches seminar in Wellington at which most regions were represented;

Coaching cont'd

- 3) Conducted the senior training squad in Whangarei;
- 4) Assisted in the final preparation of the N.Z. junior team which travelled to Australia.
- 5) Was able to make 'whistle' stop calls on several associations.

The Executive Committee has decided against negotiating for an English coach for 1983. Instead, they have decided that 1983 should be a period of consolidation on the progress made during the last four years. It is estimated that about 300 persons have attended, many more than once, courses on the English system. Whilst it would be naive to suggest that all persons who have attended a seminar are now active coaches, it is nevertheless a fact that there are now more active coaches in New Zealand than ever before. A further significant fact is that there is now uniformity in the approach to coaching.

We now have a nucleus of coaches who are capable of and have conducted junior coaching schools at National and Regional level.

It may not always be prudent to mention names for fear of omitting some but on this occasion it would, perhaps, be unfair not to mention the progress being made in the Southland, Otago and Buller areas. It is worth noting that for the first time in several years the National School for Girls will, in 1983, be held in the South Island - truly a reflection on the current standard of girls in the South Island.

The regional junior coaching schools were conducted during the May school holidays and most associations were represented. Because each association within a region is represented by an equal number of players the standard between the top and bottom players can vary quite considerably. However, the schools do provide the weaker associations and their players the opportunity to measure their standard against stronger players.

We are indebted to Geoff Rau, Keith Barnes, Bruce Shewan, Dave Cook and Ron Garrett for conducting the various junior schools. We thank them for the conscientious way they approached their assignments and for the reports submitted.

To improve the communication system between the Coaching Sub-Committee and coaches a register of coaches is being set up. It is then intended to maintain direct contact with coaches in the dissemination of information.

A coaches seminar for member nations was held after the Oceania championships held in Australia, and New Zealand was represented by Dave Cook and James Morris.

The technical information obtained will be forwarded to coaches.

In 1983 the National Junior Schools will be held at the end of January. There are two reasons for the change:

- 1) The absence of the top players in Australia in May will weaken the squad;
- 2) It is considered that any changes in technique can be more readily made prior to the commencement of a season rather than after the start of competitive play.

The senior squad will also be held in late January and this should assist in preparing the New Zealand team for their participation in the Commonwealth and World Championships. Because we will not have a visiting coach it is proposed that squad members with the experience and expertise will contribute to the running of the camp under the overall supervision of a National Selector.

The Executive is not planning to organise any coaches seminars in 1983 as it is considered that regions should be in a position to conduct courses for club coaches from their own resources. However, should assistance be required the Coaching sub-committee will be happy to try and assist.

It is absolutely essential for the future growth of the sport in New Zealand that the coaching momentum not only be maintained but increased. We and many others are convinced that this will only be achieved by the appointment of a full time Director of Coaching appointed from overseas.

The 1982 Annual General Meeting agreed to a levy on players which should raise approximately \$10,000 in 1983. Although this is a step in the right direction it is not sufficient to enable the Executive to proceed with any confidence. At the time of preparation of this report attempts to obtain a sponsor have not been successful.

Although some negative feed back on the chances of raising the necessary finance has been received it is interesting to note that none of it has emanated from areas where coaching is very active. Is there some moral to be drawn from this?

THE NITTAKU NATIONAL JUNIOR COACHING SCHOOLS:

Sponsored by the manufacturer of NITTAKU table tennis equipment, the twenty-fourth national junior coaching school for boys was held at the Manurewa Club, Browns Road, Manurewa under the direction of Coach Geoff Rau and for girls at the Empire Club, Marine Parade, Petone under the direction of Coach Keith Barnes on Friday - Sunday 14-16 May, 1982.

Richard McGillivray (Hutt Valley) also withdrew and his place was taken by Tony Radford.

There were three withdrawals from the girls school, namely, Kadia Rice (Bay of Plenty), Eileen Hoete (Auckland) and Michelle Cheetham (Manawatu). Their places were taken by Rachel Lee (Hutt Valley), Jennifer Lawn (Otago) and Pam Prince (Manawatu).

The Coaching selection committee were concerned at the number of withdrawals, and in future Associations will be asked to give an assurance that the nomination submitted are those players who will attend the schools if selected.

In a very good constructive report, Coach Geoff Rau commenting on the boys schools said, quote, "I am very impressed with the attitude of all of the players in the school. Everyone gave 100% for the full three days which is very pleasing as it was physically a very hard schedule that they were given. No one was cautioned or disciplined and coach/player and player/player relationships appeared to be good", unquote.

Dave Cook (NZ executive) was present for all sessions and he recorded scores and physical test results. Bruce Shewan the Hamilton coach was present for half of the Sunday session.

The methods used by Coach Keith Barnes at the girls school were based totally on the Peter Hirst basic principles. His report indicates that the trainees were fully involved in the coaching tuition and exercises which followed. Prior to every session a period of some 20 minutes physical exercises were carried out.

It was a good working weekend and if the girls continues with the exercises when they return to their Associations, improvements, not only in the general standard of play of the trainees themselves, but also to other Association juniors who may be watching the series of exercises being worked at, will follow.

NEW ZEALAND ASSOCIATION OF NATIONAL SPORT COACHES

The New Zealand Table Tennis Association became a corporate member of the NZ Association of National Sports Coaches as from 17 February, 1982.

As a follow up to the successful conference on 'The Principles of Coaching' held last year, a course for National Directors of Coaching, based on the sports sciences, was conducted at the Otago University, Dunedin 21-26 March, 1982. Errol Cheal, who is eminently qualified in the science of sport, particularly in relation to physical fitness and training, expressed a desire to attend the course and the NZTTA was most happy to nominate him and to pay his course registration fee. To attend the course, Errol Cheal accepted the payment for travel and accommodation.

Errol submitted a most comprehensive and instructive report and he has had personnel discussions about the lectures with Merv Allardyce, convenor of the NZTTA coaching committee. Errol hopes to find a young, dedicated player with academic know how, to be able to communicate coaching competently and who has the time and desire to travel around NZ, coaching.

The NZ Council for Recreation & Sport is conducting a conference on 'The Future for New Zealand Sport' on 9 November, 1982. Ron Menchi, Chairman NZ Executive Committee will be attending as the representative of the NZTTA.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Fresh from his triumphs at the 1982 New Zealand open championships where he won the men's singles for the first time, and with Peter Jackson took the men's doubles title, beating the reigning champions for the past six years, Morris and Lee, and then went on to win the mixed doubles title with Angela Brackenridge, 18 year old Barry John Griffiths had further success at the 2nd Oceania Championships in Sydney when he was the only player in the team contests to beat the top Australian Paul Pinkewich and the Australian junior champion Gary Haberl.

Barry also won the triple crowns in the under 18 years age group category at the New Zealand championships and was also a member of the Auckland winning team which won the Men's "A" grade title and the Boys under 18 team shield. In addition Griffiths is the current Auckland, Hamilton and North Shore men's singles champion.

A remarkable record which made his selection as the Player of the Year a foregone conclusion.

This was the third occasion that Griffiths has won the prestige award, the previous times being in the 1979 and 1980.

HISTORY OF THE AWARD

Through the generosity of the English Table Tennis Association, the net proceeds of the international contest England v New Zealand at Winchester, England in 1954, amounting to approximately 50 sterling pounds, was donated to the New Zealand Association. Using part of these funds, it was decided to introduce a Player of the Year Award based on a similar presentation conducted by the English Association. A handsome trophy was purchased and the first award was made to R.V. Jackson of Auckland in 1955.

INTERNATIONAL TOURS AND OTHER OVERSEAS ACTIVITYSixth Commonwealth Championships:

A weakened NZ men's and women's team, through the withdrawal of selected players, James Morris and Debbie Stratford, competed at the 6th Commonwealth Championships at Bombay, India, 3-9 February, 1982.

The players performed disappointedly and were unable to lift their game when the opportunity was there to win. Apart from Barry Griffiths, whose overall tour percentage of wins was just over 50%, the other players were either 50% or under which told the story of NZ's final team placings.

The New Zealand players did not proceed very far in the individual events, being eliminated in practically every case in either the first or second rounds.

While at Singapore en route, an international contest v Singapore was arranged, as well as a contest against a Vaneco invitation team. Against Singapore, the men lost 3-5 and the women won 3-2. Against the invitation team, the men won 5-4 and the women lost 1-3 to the same Singapore players they had beaten the previous evening.

In his report Nelson Tizard commented, as have other team managers before him, about match play fitness and the services of a coach. The extracts are:

Match Play Fitness

"It is essential for future tournaments held out of our season that more adequate match play is obtained immediately prior to the event. This may well mean liaising much closer with Australia who are basically in the same position. All players were playing better at the end of tournament but they should have been able to start it 'match play fit'.

Coach

"I would agree with a comment in a previous managerial report that NZ players do not really want the services of a coach but prefer to do their own advising. I doubt that there would be any person in NZ who would be acceptable as a coach to all players. Maybe the situation would be different if we had a permanent overseas coach here. For this reason I have to conclude that the prime reason for anyone accompanying a team must be that of a manager rather than a coach".

General Meeting

Nelson Tizard represented New Zealand at the conference of delegates held in conjunction with the championships. The conference dealt mainly with the adoption of a revised Constitution which closely follows the rules of the ITTF.

Len Haycraft (Australia) was appointed the Oceania representative on the Commonwealth Association's committee.

General Meeting (Cont'd)

The next Commonwealth Championships will be hosted by the Malaysia Association at Kuala Lumpur, 18-22 April, 1983.

The option for the 1985 championships was left open with likely applicants being Nigeria and England.

Sixth Asian Championships:

The NZ men's and women's team which competed at the 6th Commonwealth Championships were also intended to compete at the 6th Asian championships scheduled to be held at Djakarta, Indonesia 21-31 January, 1982. Cable advice received late in December stated that the championships had been re-scheduled for May 1982 because of pending general elections in Indonesia. Unfortunately the NZ Association had other financial commitments in May with the sending of the junior team to compete in the Australian junior championships, which necessitated foregoing sending teams to the Asian championships.

WORLD CUP QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT

The World Cup is one of the prestigious international table tennis tournaments conducted under the auspices of The International Table Tennis Federation in association with International Management Group as co-sponsors, in which sixteen of the top men players in the world compete for the Roy Evans Cup.

Included in the sixteen are the champions of the six continents of Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, North America and Oceania.

Whereas other continents have regular biennial tournament to find their representative in the World Cup, the Oceania championships is only held once every four years.

Under that system the winner represents the continent for four years in the World Cup and not surprisingly there is opposition by The International Federation who, of course, seek the same conditions for all continents in the selection of their representatives.

To overcome the situation the NZTTA proposed that representatives of Australia and New Zealand play off each year (other than in the year of the Oceania championships) to find a true Oceania champion each year.

In agreement with the Australian Association, New Zealand arranged to hold a round robin challenge series between the current Australian champion and one other and a similar pair from New Zealand.

The qualifying tournament, sponsored by NORWICH UNION INSURANCE, was held at the Upper Hutt Town Hall on Saturday 3 April, 1982. The matches were televised 'live'.

Australia was represented by Paul Pinkewich and Bob Tuckett and New Zealand by James Morris and Barry Griffiths. The contest manager was John Lelliott.

Displaying his renowned defensive qualities Paul Pinkewich easily won the tournament when he scored three wins. Bob Tuckett from Victoria beat the two New Zealanders to take second place and Barry Griffiths by beating James Morris finished in third place.

For the fifth year in succession New Zealand junior teams were accepted in the team and individual events of the Australian Junior Championships. The championships were held at the Prince Alfred College Gymnasium, Kent Town, Adelaide 16-21 May, 1982.

Further pre-tour training was held on the three days immediately prior to departure for Australia under the direction of the English national coach David Fairholm. With the emphasis being placed on preparation for match play, the sessions were of good value.

I felt this was a satisfactory result as we were well aware before we left NZ that our playing strength was less than that of previous years", quote by team coach Paul Escott.

In the individual events, Raymond Gin played exceptionally well in the under 17 boys singles when he eliminated the No. 4 seed, Matthew Walker (NSW) before going down to M. Hurst (NSW).

Toni Pairaudeau had similar success in the girls singles beating the No. 6 seed J. Herbert (WA), then losing to D. Burnage (Qld).

But the best performance came from the Hamilton girls, Toni Pairaudeau and Jane Bevan who reached the semi-final of the girls doubles.

OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Teams from Australia, Fiji, Guam, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Western Samoa competed at the 2nd Oceania Table Tennis Championships held at the MacQuarrie University gymnasium, Sydney, Australia 8-11 September, 1982.

New Zealand was represented by James Morris (Northland), Barry Griffiths (Auckland), Malcolm Temperley (North Shore), Jan Morris (Canterbury) and Christine Lee (Auckland). Manager, David Jackson (Auckland). In the team events, Australia and New Zealand were too strong for the other island territories and in a similar result to the 1st Oceania Championships at Auckland four years ago, Australia men beat New Zealand 7-2 to take the men's team championships and New Zealand beat Australia 4-1 to take the women's championships.

The two matches won for New Zealand in the men's team final were by Barry Griffiths who became the only player to beat the Australian champion, Paul Pinkewich and the Australian Junior Champion, Gary Haberl in the team contests. Griffiths hit through the defences of Pinkewich and Haberl with a devastating backhand drive which was hit as an automatic reflex and which carried too much speed to counter.

Final placings in the team events were:-

Men: 1 Australia, 2 New Zealand, 3 New Caledonia (1), 4 Guam, 5 Fiji, 6 New Caledonia (11), 7 Papua New Guinea and 8 Western Samoa.

Women: 1 New Zealand, 2 Australia, 3 Papua New Guinea, 4 New Caledonia and 5 Western Samoa.

In the individual singles, Griffiths failed to get past Bob Tucket (Victoria) who, with his staccato close to the table play, gave Griffiths no chance to settle down or to use his backhand drive to advantage. Griffiths never looked likely and in a disappointing match lost 13-21, 16-21, 17-21. James Morris found himself in the consolation singles when he lost his first round match to the No. 9 Australian Borbely and then lost to the No. 6 ranked Australian G. Tepper.

Morris and Lee reached the final of the men's doubles only to be beaten by the new Victorians from Sweden, Tommy Danielsson and G. Tepper, 18-21, 17-21, 14-21.

The women's singles was a triumph for Christine Lee who beat team mate, Jan Morris in the final. This was a unique win for Christine, as four years ago she won the 1st Oceanian women's singles title as Christine Little of Australia. At Sydney 1982 she retained the title but this time as Christine Lee of New Zealand.

As a doubles combination, Christine Lee and Jan Morris were supreme, to notch up a second title win for New Zealand.

At the meeting of delegates, David Jackson and Dave Cook represented New Zealand. In the election of officers, Ken Wilkinson (NZ) was re-elected President for a three-year term and Keith Bowler (NSW) as Executive Director.

Future Oceania championships: 1985 New Caledonia; 1988 Papua New Guinea. Decisions taken by the delegates included a suggestion that to even the standard of play, Australia and New Zealand should enter youth teams made up of players who had not competed at world championships. The suggestion was referred to the Australian and New Zealand Associations for consideration.

Oceania Coaches Seminar:

Following the championships a 3-day seminar for coaches was conducted by Eric Coster, the NSW coach. The seminar was sponsored by The International Table Tennis Federation and had as its objective, to give tuition in the art of coaching to enable a qualified coach who can teach other coaches, to be available in every country or island territory of Oceania.

New Zealanders who attended the sessions were Dave Cook, James Morris and Frank O'Gorman.

AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

A strong Korean team dominated the 37th Australian open championships hosted by the New South Wales Association at Sydney 19-24 September, 1982.

The NZ men and women players who competed at the Oceania championships stayed over to compete at the championships and had moderate successes.

In the men's doubles, Temperley and Griffiths were eliminated in the semi-finals by a Korean pair and Lee and Morris also failed at the semis being defeated by the NSW pair Pinkewich and Haberl. The Australians further demonstrated their strength by overcoming the Koreans, 14-21, 23-21, 14-21, 21-15, 21-14 to take the title.

After winning their first match the NZ doubles pair Christine Lee and Jan Morris went down easily in the next round to Denis Millikan (SA) and K.H. Choi (Korea) 19-21, 13-21, 9-21.

Griffiths and Christine Lee found the ultimate winners, Pinkewich and Denis Millikan too good in the semi-final and lost in four, 13-21, 17-21, 21-18, 20-22.

SWAYTHLING CLUB INTERNATIONAL

The aims of the Swaythling Club International which was formed at a meeting of 21 former World Championship players, held in the house of Gosta Brolin on Thursday 20 April, 1967 during the World Championships in Stockholm, were (a) to bring together former international champions and team captains who have participated in World Championships and (b) to help whenever possible, former champions. These aims were later elaborated as follows -

to develop the game; to foster international friendship; to help each other whenever possible; to meet frequently; to encourage younger players; to help the younger generation understand the importance of sportsmanship.

Membership is 'by invitation' and open only to players and captains who had taken part in World Championships and representatives of their respective countries. This rule has since been relaxed in a few individual cases but it remains the essential basis of membership.

With the addition of new members, Athol Attwood and Alf Harding in 1982, New Zealand has the following members of the Club -

Athol Attwood, Errol Cheal, Gary Frew, Alf Harding, Dick Rassie, Alan Tomlinson, Neti Traill and Ken Wilkinson. The late Keith Pointon was also a member.

The national representative of the club in New Zealand is Errol Cheal.

NZ TABLE TENNIS DEVELOPMENT TRUST

The first recipient to receive a grant from the NZ Table Tennis Development Trust was Kadia Rice (Bay of Plenty). The Trustees, John Lelliott (Chairman), Trevor Flint, Bob Lassen and Nelson Tizard, approved a grant of \$350 as a contribution towards the expenses to enable Kadia to undertake 3-months training in England. Kadia departs Auckland on 29 December and on arrival in England will stay with David Fairholm and his family.

The NZ Table Tennis Development Trust was established on 1 May, 1982. The Trust Fund is to provide financial assistance for NZ players to develop their game to international standards by travelling overseas for competitive play and coaching. The assistance would mainly be for young players who had reached or were approaching top NZ standards and who had the potential for further improvement. The Trust Fund could also be used for NZ coaches to attend overseas coaching seminars to improve their coaching techniques.

Membership of the Development Trust is open to any individual, local authority or business firm or table tennis association with an initial annual subscription of a minimum of \$10.

The following quote by Tomie Campbell in the paper 'Freedom in Sport' summarises the aims of the Development Trust Fund -

"Every country must have its sporting 'elite' because they are the focus of national pride and the ultimate expression of sports continuing search for excellence - the elite provide the enthusiasm and stimulus for effort and involvement by other participants."

NATIONAL LOTTERY

The following report on the outcome of the 1982 national lottery is supplied by Mike Heenan, the national organiser.

"The NZ Association endeavoured to boost sales in the 1982 national lottery by providing larger prizes for a \$1 ticket or a concessional book of six tickets for \$5.

Once again problems were encountered in arranging suitable prizes and sponsorship to help defray expenses. We are grateful to WHITCOULLS LIMITED who made an advertising grant which was used to offset ticket printing costs.

These early delays meant that once again Associations were faced with selling tickets in the latter part of the season.

When final figures were collated, a total of 48,123 tickets were sold as against sales of 62,776 50¢ tickets in 1981.

Comments received from Associations indicated that most would prefer an earlier selling period and many were not happy having to handle books of six tickets"

Only one candidate became fully qualified by passing the test paper and the practical examination; two candidates passed the test paper to qualify as probationary umpires; one candidate passed the practical test but failed the theory paper and five candidates had their test paper marked 'failed'.

The successful candidate who qualified as a Provincial Umpire was Tony Irvine (Southland) and the two candidates who became Probationary Umpires were Warwick White (Canterbury) and Eldon Potaka (Canterbury).

International Umpire: Mike McAvinue was again a candidate for the 8th international examination and the result is awaited.

New Zealand National Umpire: With the untimely death of Keith Pointon who was preparing the test paper, the introduction of the NZ national umpires examination did not come about as promised. The test paper is now expected to be introduced in 1983.

The Alan and Edna McCallum Umpiring Trophies: The judges who decided the junior umpires of the year, were Frank O'Gorman, Lee Mummery and Mary Broadbent. The 1982 winners were Alan Swayle (North Shore) and Helen Beumelberg (Canterbury).

In his report on the junior section of the NZ championships, John Lelliott, the NZ Liaison Officer commented, quote, "It appears there were very few juniors in the running and the overall standard of junior umpiring was not good. Consideration should be given to asking Associations for nominations in future years, as this would undoubtedly motivate a number of juniors to prepare themselves and in the long run could only improve the overall standard of umpiring", unquote.

The NZ national teams which competed at the 2nd Oceania championships at Sydney in September, 1982 and the teams to compete at the 1983 Commonwealth and World Championships and the 1983 Australian junior championships will also be outfitted.

The contract remains in force till 31 December, 1983 with mutual agreement for one more year.

We are pleased to be on the mailing list for the receipt of the '83 BUTTERFLY CALENDAR with its colourful portraits of international table tennis stars.

"The Table Tennis Report" with its English supplement covering world-wide surveys and other interesting articles is also being received.

The NZ Association is pleased to be associated with BUTTERFLY table tennis clothing and equipment and is extremely grateful to President Hikosuke Tamasu for the continual interest he has shown in the development of table tennis in New Zealand.

**** NZ Sports Foundation Inc.

Barry Griffiths continues to be supported by the NZ Sports Foundation by way of a development grant and is scheduled to be in Japan in the New Year for three months fitness training and coaching to improve his technical skills as part of his preparation to compete at the Commonwealth and World championships.

The NZ Sports Foundation is aware that continual overseas training is necessary for the utmost to be received from Developmental grants. Barry has already shown by results at the 1982 NZ championships and Oceania team matches that the period of training in Sweden last year has improved his game.



PERMANENT TROPHIES

We gratefully acknowledge the receipt of four new trophies during the year. There were:-

- **** 'Player Development Trophy' for the North Island under 14 boys' singles, donated by Graeme Davies, Convenor of Auckland's Player Development Committee which organises junior development, coaching and inter-school activities.
- **** 'Manawatu Table Tennis Association 50th Jubilee Shield' for the NZ junior teams championships - under 18 boys 'B' grade section.
- **** 'Davis Cup' for the boys' doubles under 12 years event of the NZ junior championships. Donated by Mr and Mrs Arthur Davis of Lower Hutt.
- **** 'Dave Cook Cup' for the NZ secondary schools team final. Donated by Dave Cook, a member of the NZ executive committee; the cup replaces the H.L. Clarke Cup which has been lost.

Two trophies destroyed in the Auckland Stadium fire have now been replaced.

They were the

- 'Arnold Percy Memorial Trophy' for the 35 years and over men's singles event of the NZ championships, and
- 'Arthur Meachen Memorial Cup', Association award for the NZ open and senior age group finals.

Through the courtesy of the Managing Director of Edward Lumley & Son Ltd, Auckland, a replacement cup for the North Island boys' singles under 16 years event has been received. The previous Edward Lumley Cup was declared to be damaged beyond repair.

Trophies required:

For the NZ junior championships, the following event has not yet been covered by a permanent trophy -

under 12 years age group; mixed doubles event - 2 cups required.

There are also a number of events for the South Island championships, particularly doubles events in the junior section requiring trophies. Specifications laid down for the donation of permanent trophies are;

EPNS or better, plinth to be plastic or wood, total height of trophy and plinth to be not less than 30cm, height of plinth not less than 8mm, value of trophy to be not less than \$60 retail, title engraving of trophy to be discussed.

Great strain was put on the finances under review this year. The Association carried out the same activities on the same scale as for the last three years. However, the costs incurred in carrying out these activities have soared and compared to three years ago have doubled. A substantial working loss is the result.

Four coaching schools, three coaching seminars and two training squads held in conjunction with a visit by an English coach, David Fairholm and the sending of a NZ junior team to Australia were the main events of the season, involving considerable expenditure from revenue funds. The coaching programme received assistance by way of a financial grant of \$7,000 from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport. The tour to Australia was made possible by contributions of \$4,000 received from the players and manager.

The sending of a NZ team to the Commonwealth championships in India was made possible by using the remaining funds in the Overseas Tour Fund, contributions of \$4,200 received from the players and manager and a grant of \$4,166 received from the International Sports Competition Fund.

A grant of \$5,874 was received from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport to offset administration costs which rose slightly from \$20,222 last year to \$20,739 this year. The net costs of coaching and two tours to Australia (juniors and Oceania) totalled \$15,120 in 1982 compared to \$6,515 last year. The substantial loss shown in the accounts is due to this area of operation.

Income this year rose by \$3,000 due to an increase in affiliation fee from \$11,459 to \$16,696 this year. This was partly offset by the reduction in interest from \$2,388 to \$466 due to the redemption of all of our term deposits. The national lottery again brought in a poor result. The future lotteries, whether of a 'Cascade' type or as at present, must incorporate a 'guarantee income' provision for the NZ Association if we are ever going to raise funds.

The net current working capital has decreased alarmingly from \$28,393 in 1980 to \$18,083 in 1981 to \$6,500 in October, 1982. The Association had to redeem its term deposits with Marac Finance Ltd, \$5,000, and Westpac Banking Corporation, \$3,000, during the year to provide working funds. The above trend needs to be arrested immediately.

A setback was suffered when the proceeds available from a Government lottery run on behalf of sporting bodies were limited for distribution only to 50% of overseas travel and accommodation costs for World and Commonwealth championships. Tours to Australia do not qualify. Nor did the junior tour to Australia in 1982 receive any grant from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport.

Because no English coach will be engaged in 1983 and we are looking for billets or cheaper accommodation for the NZ junior team to Sydney next year, it is expected that the total operating expenses (excluding World and Commonwealth championships) for 1983 will be up to \$20,500. Normal income of \$25,500 is expected to be received. This leaves only \$5,000 available, before fund raising, with which to finance the sending of the NZ teams to Kuala Lumpur and Tokyo. Budgeted minimum cost to date is \$19,500.

Government grants, players' contributions and lottery income will be sought, not only to make up the deficit, but to provide sufficient funds to re-establish the Overseas Tour Reserve Account. Failure to raise these monies will mean curtailment of some of our normal activities in the future.
