



MEMBERSHIP:

With returns still to come from a number of Associations, it is not possible to establish the New Zealand statistics. From the returns received, it has been noted that there is a change of emphasis with the number of clubs affiliated. Some Associations no longer include the number of schools in a school's competition, nor the number of business firms competing in a pre-Winter season competition. There is, therefore, an abbreviated return of actual table tennis clubs but not encompassing all known organisations where table tennis is played.

Despite the efforts of President, Gary Farquhar, to keep the wheels moving, the Rotorua Association went into recess for lack of people to come forward to organise and control the activities. This is a matter of concern because there are at least six clubs in the township.

As a consequent of this recess, the Taupo Sub-Association was granted permission to affiliate with the East Waikato Association, but because there was only one club functioning in Taupo with little likelihood that the situation would change in the foreseeable future, the title was changed to "Taupo Table Tennis Club". It is not expected that the name change will have any significant impact on the open tournament held each year in Taupo.

It is abundantly clear that there are many family groups who play table tennis at home as a form of recreation but not as a sport. Family groups should be encouraged to join with other family groups to form a club and to take part in the local table tennis activities. IT IS THE PARENTS FROM WHERE THE ORGANISATIONAL SUPPORT FOR THE ASSOCIATION WILL COME FROM.

SNIPPETS:

**** Full Time Development Officer:

Bryan Keane, President, North Shore Association has ideas for the establishment of a stronger North Shore Association identity. Future plans include the building of a 20-table stadium, continual fund raising, regular coaching activities, better public relations and communication. To make it all possible, a person who can innovate ideas and has the enthusiasm and ability will be employed. Bryan says, "It is very hard to get people together if there is no real place they can meet on neutral ground. At the moment, we all meet in a club hall and I feel that by having a full time independent officer who can motivate people, any resistance at present coming from some of the smaller clubs, should disappear and we will obtain unity of purpose from all clubs."

Good luck to Bryan Keane and to the North Shore Association. We will watch future developments with interest:

**** German Coach in NZ:

North Shore have a qualified German coach who has only been in New Zealand a short time, but who has already made a great impact on their training and coaching programme. The influence and confidence Peter Schloots gives the players is very good and he is held in high esteem by all with whom he comes in contact. In his early thirties, his experience and years of dedication gives him a backing for future table tennis successes. Peter Schloots' involvement with the North Shore came through negotiations by the St Josephs Club and the President of the North Shore Association. The engagement is proving very good for the sport. Peter Schloots is also a very successful person in the computer field.

**** Auckland has a permanent Coach:

Richard Lee is now employed by the Auckland Association as a Coach. He took up an appointment as the Auckland Coach on 12 June, 1983 and his initial contract is for twelve months on a basis of 10 hours coaching each week over 30 weeks of the year.

May I congratulate you on the evident success of the International Tournament this year. Newspapers here report an attendance of 10,000 spectators at the final games - surely an indication of the great popularity of table tennis in England.

**** Paul Escott and the Buller Sub-Association:

The Buller Sub-Association sees value in bringing the Wellington Coach, Paul Escott to Westport to provide coaching tuition for their players. John Hunt, the area coach/organiser said, "The players all fully appreciate the clear instructions and sympathetic advice given by Paul who, for the second year, coaching on 'an expenses only' basis donated his normal professional fees." Paul has been invited to return to the Coast next year, same time, same place.

**** Lengthy Service:

Congratulations to Alister St John who has been secretary of the Nelson Association for 33 years. Well done Al. It is a great record and the NZ Executive Committee join with the Nelson Association in recording appreciation of your services to the sport.

**** Another meritorious record is that of Thelma May who has served as a member of the Canterbury executive committee for 21 years and who has played over 300 times for Canterbury. Thelma is a life-member of the Canterbury Association and a Vice-President of the NZ Association.

**** Believe it or not:

At the World team events in Tokyo, Japan, April 1983, Federal Germany were down 0-4 against France, but fought back to level the match score 4-4 only to be beaten in the final match to lose the contest 4-5.

In the first of the crossovers to decide relegation, Germany led Denmark 4-0 and went further ahead by winning the first game of the fifth match and led 13-7 in the second game. But that was all they could do, for in a remarkable come-back, the Danes pushed Germany into the second category with a 5-4 win!

**** "50 Years Across the Table" is the title of a book written by Ken Wilkinson which traverses the history of the NZ Table Tennis Association 1934 - 1983. The book of 167 pages supported by 74 illustrations will be on sale early in the New Year at a retail price of NZ \$9.95. The book is sponsored by SHELL.

**** 1982 New Zealand Herald Junior Sports Award:

Two table tennis players, Peter Jackson (Auckland) and Kadia Rice (Bay of Plenty) were amongst the seven juniors chosen as the 1982 New Zealand Herald Junior Sports Awards winners announced on 22 January, 1983. The winners and their parents were guest of the Wilson and Horton Ltd, publishers of the Herald at a luncheon where each were presented with a medallion.

NEW ZEALAND JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

(a) Inter-Association Teams Championships:

Two late withdrawals of junior teams caused problems. North Taranaki Association withdrew both its boys' and girls' teams in the under 18 team contests and the NSW Country Association's boys' teams under 15 also withdrew, because of illness and unavailability of two of its players. The NSW team withdrawal also affected the individual events and seedings. While we wish to encourage overseas entries, particularly from Australia, a firmer stance will need to be taken to ensure receipt of a stronger confirming entry at the time entries close, to avoid the inconvenience caused this year. 19 boys' and 16 girls' teams, in the under 18 years age group and 21 boys' and 14 girls' teams in the under 15 years age group competed for the junior inter-association teams honours in the respective grades. Last year there were 38 teams in the under 18 group and 31 in the under 15 section.

The team contests were conducted by the Auckland Association at the AIR NEW ZEALAND STADIUM, Auckland on 24/25 August, 1983.

The Auckland boys team were again successful in winning the Hawkes Bay Shield for the under 18 "A" grade competition. The team was undefeated and won each contest in a convincing manner.

Likewise Manawatu were too strong in the "B" grade. Bay of Plenty who finished 4th in the "C" grade had the unenviable record of losing 5-6 to three Associations, including Southland, the ultimate winner of the grade.

There was excitement plenty in the girls under 18 "A" grade competition with the defending champions Hamilton beating Hutt Valley 6-5, but losing to Auckland 4-7 and with Hutt Valley beating Auckland 7-4 to give a three way tie. On the count back, Hutt Valley pipped Auckland by the odd game with Hamilton in 3rd place.

The acquisition of the NZ junior representative, Sandra Mayers, who is now residing in Nelson, had the right impact for a strong performance by the Nelson girls to take the "B" grade title.

In the under 15 sections, the Northland Association, led by the Traill brothers and supported by Lance McKeeg and Bruce Maugham had no difficulty in annexing the Lassen Shield as winners of the boys "A" grade. South Canterbury, led by the Brosnahan brothers, had a good tournament and were undefeated in the "B" grade.

Hutt Valley swept all before them to win the girls under 15 "A" grade for the Ron Gibbons Shield. After a real tussell in the combined sections of the "B" grade, Marlborough secured 1st place with a 6-5 win over Manawatu.

(b) NZ Junior Individual Championships

New South Wales and Victorian Juniors were prominent in taking the major title in the under 18 and under 16 years events. The sequence was only broken by Eileen Hoete (Auckland) and Megan Taylor (Marlborough) in the mixed doubles events.

Under the supervision of Noel Shorter of International Table Tennis Pty Ltd, Lakemba, NSW, who continues to support NZ championship events and who has done so much for the encouragement of Australian juniors, a team of boys, Gary Haberl, Michael Bowrey, Mark Palmay (NSW) and Eddie Kasser and Paul Tonkin (Victoria) entered the individual events. They were supported by Andrea Campbell, the talented 16-year-old from NSW who has been a frequent traveller across the Tasman.

Both Gary Haberl, the Australian international and Andrea Campbell won all three titles in the under 18 years events, while Eddie Kasser and Andrea Campbell repeated the performance in the under 16 events.

But if the Australians can do it, so can Hutt Valley players who scooped the pool in the under 12 years cadet events. 11-year-old Darren Sears and 12-year-old Susan Cuthbert won the three titles, singles, doubles and mixed. They were helped by two other Hutt Valley players, Brendon Pearson in the boys' doubles and Paula McNicholl in the girls' doubles.



- (a) Senior Inter-Association Teams Championships

The Auckland stranglehold on the top grade of the men's and women's teams championships tightened a notch in 1983. The strong Auckland men's team of Barry Griffiths, Peter Jackson, Richard Lee, Kevin Schick and Raymond Gin, coasted through undefeated, winning by wide margins, to chalk up their eighth consecutive year as the national champion team. The Auckland women, Chris Lee, Shelley Bougher, Angela Brakenridge and Eileen Hoete also went through undefeated, but not as convincingly as the men. Nevertheless, the ninth successful defence of the title by the Auckland women's team is still one better than the men's effort.

The Hamilton's men's team was also impressive, giving the opposition no chance to take the Russell Algie Shield as the winners of the "B" grade. Next year, Hamilton will be playing in the "A" grade at the expense of Canterbury who were relegated to "B" grade.

Kapiti men's team could not hold on to their promotion from last year and reverts back to "C" grade under the new automatic promotion and relegation system.

Outstanding form to be undefeated in the "C" grade which also means promotion for next year was shown by the Southland men's teams.

In the women's section, it was a black day for the South Island when the Otago women's team was relegated to "B" grade. Although Otago did not win a contest, the team, nevertheless, took the powerful Auckland team to a 5-6 score which was a closer result than that which was recorded by some of the other teams in the grade.

The young Manawatu team did well to win the "B" grade Canterbury Shield and it will be interesting to see how they fare next year in "A" grade.

The former Cantabrian, Sandra Mayes, made a difference to the strength of the Nelson women's team in the "C" grade. As a team, Carolyn Jary, Joy Evans and Sandra Mayes, led Nelson through the contests without a loss, much to the delight and joy of their supporters.

Twenty-three men's teams (24 last year) and 19 women's teams (20) competed for the various team honours at the AIR NEW ZEALAND STADIUM, Auckland on 29/30 August, 1983.

VICTOR BARNA DUNLOP CUPS AWARDS

For the first time in the history of the competition, a list of points scored by each men's and women's team and their placing in the competition, is not available for publication. Through a misunderstanding, the judges, Elva Bray (convenor), Frances Brackenridge, Esther Forster and Gwen Jones, supplied only the first three placings which were:

HISTORY OF THE COMPETITION

During his tour of New Zealand in 1949, accompanied by Richard Bergmann, Victor Barna offered a trophy for the promotion of "inter-town competition" on a knock-out basis, or such other promotion of the sport as the New Zealand Executive Committee thought fit.

The trophy was received in 1950 through the courtesy of Dunlop Sports (N.Z.) Ltd, who requested that the trophy be known as the "Victor Barna Dunlop Cup".

The New Zealand Executive Committee decided that the cup shall be awarded annually to the Association whose team or teams, competing in the Inter-Association Teams Championships, excel in play, in sportsmanship, appearance, team spirit and punctuality. At first it was decided that the award shall be won by an Association and not by any one team of that Association, in the belief that the award would be an incentive to all Associations to maintain better discipline and foster stronger team spirit among all its players. However, difficulty arose when some Associations had only one team competing, while others had two, and after the first two years of competition, the rules were amended so that each team could be considered on its own merits. In 1965, the rules were further amended to provide for two separate competitions, one for men's teams and one for women's teams and again through the courtesy of Dunlop Sports (N.Z.) Ltd, a second identical cup was presented.

(b) New Zealand National Open Championships

The dazzling young Australians, Gary Haberl and Andrea Campbell carried their successes in the junior championships to the senior open events, with Haberl winning the men's singles and Campbell being runner-up in the women's singles. As a combination they won the mixed doubles.

Gary Haberl won easily when he beat the defending champion, Barry Griffiths in the final, 21-17, 21-16, 21-18. He became the third Australian to etch his name on the NZ men's singles records - Cliff McDonald did it in 1965, Paul Pinkewich, 12 years later in 1977.

Griffiths had difficulty in making his shots because of a hand injury. During the Victorian Club Championships final prior to the New Zealand Championships, Griffiths split his thumb when attempting a forehand loop. This injury required five stitches from knuckle to nail. While competing at the NZ championships, the stitches were removed but the thumb became infected.

Chris Lee was too strong for the 16-year-old Australian Andrea Campbell and won her first New Zealand women's singles title, 21-17, 21-11, 21-18. Chris had previously been an Australian singles titleholder as well as twice Oceania champion, first as an Australian representative and second when representing New Zealand.

In the semi-finals, Campbell's attacking game was too consistent for Jan Morris, the NZ team captain and in an upset, Campbell won 14-21, 21-18, 21-19, 21-14. Chris Lee found Shelley Bougher full of fight in the other semi-final and in an exciting match held on to win, 20-22, 21-17, 21-10, 22-20.

Beating the previous titleholders for the second year in succession, Aucklanders, Griffiths and Jackson confirmed the end of the reign of Morris and Lee as the men's doubles champions.

Ann Gyongyos and Kristen Phillips, North Island champions and winners of numerous provincial titles, scored the big one when they ousted Shelley Bougher and Kadia Rice in the final of the women's doubles. The Wellington/Hutt valley pair had previously beaten the titleholders, Jan Morris and Angela Brackenridge in the semi-finals.

After surviving a torrid five-game match to beat the defending titleholders, Griffiths and Brackenridge, the Cantrabians, Maurice Burrowes and Jan Morris found the going even harder when they met the 3rd seeds, Haberl and Campbell in the semi-finals. The Australians won 21-11, 21-15, 15-21, 21-17 and went on to beat the NZ representatives, Peter Jackson and Christine Lee, 21-15, 16-21, 21-18, 21-18 to become the mixed doubles champions.

As a successful innovation, the receipt of entries was directed to Auckland and later fed through a computer programming to provide detailed information to assist the NZ Ranking and Seeding sub-committee. The programming included selecting players of even playing standard for pairing in doubles events. The NZ Committee nominated the seeded players for all events and a computer draw was prepared. There were other useful data which the programming provided such as an alphabetical list of name, addresses, telephone numbers, date of birth of competitors, and list of players who had entered junior events, the total number of entries and so on.

The computer programming saved hours of tedious manual acceptance, checking and typing of entries as well as hours of work in preparing and checking the draw. Computer processing should continue to be the procedure for the acceptance of entries.

It was a very good championship, made more interesting by the entry of the best of the Australian juniors. Congratulations to the Auckland Association and the Organising Committee headed by Bob King for the splendid organisation.

ARTHUR MEACHEN MEMORIAL CUP

The Arthur Meachen Memorial Cup, which is awarded to the Association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the open and age group events at the NZ championships, was won by the Auckland Association for the fourth year in succession.

With Australian players scoring 10 points but not being eligible for the Association Award, the win by Christine Lee in the women's singles and Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson, men's doubles, was sufficient without taking into account the age group events, for the Auckland Association to be clear winners of the Arthur Meachen Memorial Cup.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the open events, with doubles partners sharing the points and 2 points for the age group events, with doubles partners sharing the points.

Inter-Island Contests

The unavailability of leading players, gave the North Island selector, Alan Tomlinson, an opportunity to introduce young players who had not played in the inter-island contests before. His selection of Wendy Cuthbert meant that she joined a select few who have represented both the North and South Islands.

Alan Tomlinson was successful with his selection of the men's team. The North Island team thrashed the South Island, conceding only one game in 25 to record another 12-0 win. The women were not so successful. The top two, Angela Brackenridge and Kadia Rice, could not get past the experienced former NZ champions, Jan Morris and Yvonne Fogarty-Eyre. The other two singles and doubles were shared to allow the South Island to come out winners 8 matches to 4. The South Island women's team thereby scored their fourth victory over the North Island in a long series of contests.

As usual the South Island selector, Frank O'Gorman did not have a variety of selection which his counterpart had, but he made a bold selection by naming Michael Prisk and 16-year-old Grant McCarroll, both from Canterbury, in his men's team and the promising 17-year-old Sandra Mayes of Nelson as his fourth women player.

While Prisk and McCarroll appeared out of their depth, nevertheless it was Grant McCarroll who took the only game conceded by the North Island when he pushed Alan Shewan to three, the scores in favour of Shewan being 17-21, 21-7, 21-13.

Sandra Mayes justified her selection with a win over Wendy Cuthbert (North Island) and for the support she gave Yvonne Fogarty-Eyre in the nail-biting doubles win, 22-20, 22-20, against Angela Brackenridge and Kadia Rice.



NORTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Experience and concentration won for James Morris (Northland), his seventh North Island men's singles title. Two-down and trailing in the third, he could see the title slipping from him, but then, in a dramatic change when his opponent Peter Jackson (Auckland) let the crowd's interest in the women's singles being played at the same time on a nearby table to affect his

concentration, Morris came back into the match to win the last three games and the title 22-24, 20-22, 21-16, 21-14, 21-14. The Wellingtonian, Ann Gyongyos scored a major success when she beat the NZ representative, Christine Lee (Auckland) in the final of the women's singles, 21-17, 23-21, 11-21, 12-21, 22-20. With the young Hutt Valley player, Kristen Phillips, Ann took her second open title when the pair regained the women's doubles title. With Ron Foster (Hutt Valley) she was runner-up in the open mixed doubles and she won the women's singles 35 years and over.

For the fourth year in succession James Morris (Northland) and Richard Lee (Auckland) won the men's doubles title beating the younger pair, Alan Pedley (Franklin) and Alan Shewan (Hamilton) in the final 22-20, 21-17, 18-21, 21-18. In a tight 5-game semi-final, Pedley and Shewan stopped the run of Ron Foster and Simeon Cairns who has caused the upset of the championships when they beat the 2nd seeds, Peter Jackson and Malcolm Darroch in an earlier round, 16-21, 21-13, 22-20, 21-19.

The South Island scored its only success when, in two hard fought matches, Pam Shadbolt (Canterbury), re-paired with Malcolm Darroch (Franklin) through the withdrawal of her original partner, beat Richard and Christine Lee in the semi-final 21-18, 21-18, 17-21, 19-21, 21-19 and Ron Foster and Ann Gyongyos in the final, 17-21, 21-12, 21-23, 21-17, 21-7.

In the junior ranks, the form players came through. The aggressive and positive play of Willie Shaw (Hutt Valley) and Jane Bevan (Hamilton) winning the under 18 boys and girls singles were particularly good. Hutt Valley players dominated most of the cadet events with only Murray Traill (Northland), Colin Gin and Sharon Coad (Auckland) stopping the grand slam in the under 14 and under 12 events.

The COUNTRYWIDE BUILDING SOCIETY North Island championships conducted by the Manawatu Association at the Manawatu Sports Stadium Palmerston North on 8-10 July 1983 attracted a large quality entry. Full credit must go to the Chairman of the Organising Committee, Mike McAvinue and his team for the smooth organisation which resulted in a most successful championships.

SOUTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Jan Morris won her seventh women's singles title at the GENERAL FINANCE South Island championships held at the Canterbury Table Tennis headquarters, Christchurch on Saturday/Sunday 2/3 July, 1983. She beat team-mate Pam Shadbolt in the final 21-14, 21-8, 21-13. In a weak field, the NZ team captain never looked in danger of losing the title. Jan has now won the women's title more times than anyone else in the history of the championships.

Top seeded 27-year-old Maurice Burrowes, winner of the Canterbury open singles, continued his excellent form by surviving a torrid five-game match against fellow Cantabrian, Michael Hamel, 21-18, 21-16, 12-21, 23-25, 21-8 to take the men's singles title for the second time after a period of 10 years. Burrowes last won the title in 1973. The battle for the 1983 title had its turning point in the fourth game in which Hamel trailed 13-19 but fought back to lead 20-19. Burrowes levelled at 20-20, then lost three match points before Hamel settled the issue and forced Burrowes into a fifth and deciding game. The spectacular fourth game, however, was too much for Hamel and he trailed all the way in the fifth before Burrowes finished it off with an easy 21-7 win.

Jan Morris completed the open treble by winning the women's doubles title with Pam Shadbolt and the mixed doubles with Maurice Burrowes.

A strong contingent from the Hutt Valley and Manawatu scored successes in the junior events. The outstanding player was Tanya McAvinue who scooped the pool in the under 18 years as well as winning the under 16 singles and doubles with Jennifer Lawn and being runner-up in the mixed doubles. It should also be mentioned that Tanya, and her partner 17-year-old Sandra Mayes (Nelson), were the losing finalists in the open women's doubles event.

In the cadet events Maxine Goldie (West Coast) and Kevin Brosnahan (South Canterbury) were outstanding in the under 14 and under 12 years events respectively.

The NZ liaison officer, John Lelliott had little difficulty in annexing both the 35 and 45 years men's singles title.

In his report on the conduct of the Championships John Lelliott wrote, quote, "The Tournament Manager, Mr Trevor Flint, and his team worked very hard through the two days in very cold conditions. In particular I would like to congratulate Mr Bruce Lockhart, Miss J. Stead and Miss N. White for their complete dedication to the Tournament, "unquote. In the list of results received, Hutt Valley Association shows the way in their vigorous promotion of representative contests for all ages and standards.


The northern regions get together for their annual senior and junior round robin tournaments; the South Island inter-association teams tournament is a feature of the winter season's activities for all South Island Associations;

the unusual geographical combination of Marlborough, Mid Canterbury and Kapiti works well when they meet on an annual basis and as to be expected there are other close-lying Association combinations, e.g. Wellington, Hutt Valley and Kapiti; Canterbury and South Canterbury; Otago and Southland; North Taranaki and Wanganui which add to the annual representative scene.

Nelson retained the Perry Shield with a spectacular record win over Marlborough; Franklin came back to reverse last year's result in the senior Sutton Shield contests and continue to show their strength in the junior competition and the Sweetman Shield is being keenly fought for by the central North Island districts.

REGISTER OF COACHES

A list of coaches was prepared and the register is being used as a mailing list of coaches to whom it is intended to forward direct, circulars pertaining to coaching matters. The reaction to the first newsletter was favourable and as long as all coaches make a contribution to it then it should provide a useful forum for coaches.

NATIONAL COACH

The funding and appointment of a national coach remains a priority of the Executive. Although an annual meeting has agreed in principle to the desirability of having a national coach, the method of funding and the amount required has not yet been settled. It has been interesting to note that, generally speaking, support for proposals for higher levies has come from Associations which are pursuing an active coaching programme. They can see the merit in having a national coach, based on the results which they are achieving through their own efforts. The national executive had been considering negotiating for an overseas coach to visit New Zealand in 1984 for an extended period. However, as a result of a meeting of coaches, which was held during the 1983 national championships, it has now been decided not to pursue the temporary engagement. This meeting expressed the view that we should instead, press for a full time coach. As a further step it was suggested that a greater effort be made to 'sell' the concept to Associations, preferably by someone not on the national executive.

Mrs Neti Traill has volunteered to take on this demanding task and it is planned that she will visit Associations during February 1984. It is hoped that Associations will avail themselves of the opportunity to hear the case which will be submitted and to put questions to Mrs Traill. It is also hoped that Associations will ensure that their executive committee and others interested attend the meetings.

THE NITTAKU NATIONAL JUNIOR COACHING SCHOOLS

Sponsored by the manufacturers of NITTAKU table tennis equipment, the twenty-fifth national junior coaching school for boys and girls was held at the Empire Club, Marine Parade, Petone under the direction of Coach, David Cook. The girls' school was held at the Canterbury Association's headquarters, Christchurch under the direction of Coach Ron Garrett. Both schools were held during the weekend 28-30 January, 1983.

With the absence of New Zealand juniors competing at the Australian junior teams and individual championships which is held in May during the school holidays, it was necessary to find a new timing for the holding of the national junior coaching schools. The last week of January was therefore selected and although the new dates brought difficulties, the change was generally accepted. Both coaches referred to the oppressive heat during training, which, of course, was seasonal, but nevertheless one of the difficulties. It was also mentioned that as the season proper appeared to be a long time away there was difficulty in motivating the players. Although there has been objections expressed about the timing, the Coaching Committee considers that, on balance, the January period should be persevered with in the meantime.

Conditions at both venues were good and sufficient. The hospitality given by the Hutt Valley and Canterbury Associations were first class. The interest and attention to organisation details given by the hosting Associations for the coaching weekend is much appreciated by the NZ Executive Committee.

NEW ZEALAND ASSOCIATION OF NATIONAL SPORTS COACHES

The NZ Table Tennis Association is a corporated member of the NZ Association of National Sports Coaches. NZ Life-Member, Error Cheal is a registered member of the Association. The information and expertise at all levels of coaching which is being provided by the National Sports Coaches Association is most useful and is being adapted to the continual expansion of table tennis coaching. The Coaches Association is proposing to set up a 'Master Coach' accreditation scheme to ensure that national coaches understand and can apply expertise pertaining to sports sciences of bio mechanics, fitness physiology and psychology, management, communication and sports medicine.

Ron Menchi will represent the NZTTA at a combined conference to be held in Wellington 25-27 November, 1983, the programme of which will cover 'The Rationale for a 'Master Coach' Accreditation Scheme': 'Accreditation Procedure', 'coaching at international level' and other topical subjects.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Listed first, among other performances which could be taken into account, when considering selections for the Player of the Year award is

- any outstanding performance in the teams events at a world championships

18-year-old Peter Jackson met this consideration at the 37th World championships at Tokyo, Japan in the important three play-off contests for world classification positions.

- (i) New Zealand beat Spain 5-4. With the scores levelled at 4-4, Peter Jackson won the big match to beat Moles, 21-16, 21-18, to put New Zealand one-up in the cross-over contests.
- (ii) In the next contest versus Cuba which New Zealand won 5-3, Peter Jackson played well to beat the opposition No. 1 Betancourt who beat both Morris and Griffiths.
- (iii) Against Dominican Republic, New Zealand was down 1-4. Then came the fightback with Peter Jackson easily beating Fermin, 21-10, 21-15 and Barry Griffiths and James Morris clinching their matches to level the score at 4-4. Once again it was Peter Jackson and his determination which would decide the final placing of the NZ team. Peter rose to the occasion superbly and in an exciting match beat the Dominican Republic top player, Alvarex, 21-16, 15-21, 21-17 to give New Zealand 37th position in the world classification.

Geoff Rau, the NZ Coach, commented in his report that one of the highlights of the team matches was Peter's improvement and competitiveness.

It was a tremendous international debut for Peter Jackson and rightly earned him the prestigious NZ Player of the Year Award.

The Player of the Year cup and memento will be presented to Peter Jackson at a function to be held in the Auckland Stadium lounge on 10 November, 1983. The Minister of Recreation and Sport has been approached to make the presentation.

HISTORY OF THE AWARD

Through the generosity of the English Table Tennis Association, the net proceeds of the international contest England V New Zealand at Winchester, England in 1954, amounting to approximately 50 sterling pounds, was donated to the New Zealand Association. Using part of these funds, it was decided to introduce a player of the Year Award based on a similar presentation conducted by the English Association. A handsome trophy was purchased and the first award was made to R.V. Jackson of Auckland in 1955.

INTERNATIONAL TOURS AND OTHER OVERSEAS ACTIVITY

1. Seventh Commonwealth Championships The NZ men's team finished at a disappointing 10th place at the Commonwealth Championships held at the Negara Stadium, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia 17-23 April, 1983. The saving grace was that NZ was ahead of Canada who they beat in the first of the "cross-over" contests.

The women's team at No. 6 improved their ratings to be ahead of Malaysia, Scotland, Australia and Northern Ireland.

No New Zealand player was ranked in the 1983 Commonwealth classification. Conditions were hot, humid and steamy with the air conditioning not functioning in the playing area. Temperatures in the stadium varied between 25C in the early morning to 35C in the afternoon.

A comprehensive report by the team manager, Nelson Tizard, together with detailed results and comments by the team coach, Geoff Rau, have been widely circulated. It will suffice at this stage to summarise the team results and to make mention of the best performance of a New Zealand player in the individual events.

Individual events: In an exciting first round match, considered by many who saw it, to be the best entertaining match of the championships, James Morris bowed out to Dougie Johnson (England) in a marathon match which went to five games. The score in favour of Johnson was 21-14, 18-21, 21-10, 19-21, 24-22.

Commonwealth Meeting: Nelson Tizard represented New Zealand at the meeting of Commonwealth delegates. The meeting dealt with ways and means of increasing the income of the Association mainly by team levies. A "Contab" newsletter is to be issued. In rotation with Australia, Ken Wilkinson (New Zealand) was appointed the Oceania representative on the Commonwealth Association's committee for the two year term 1983/85.

Mie Prefecture: Following the Commonwealth Championships, the New Zealand delegation were guests of Kyoji Murayama and the Mie Prefectural Government at Tsu, Japan. During the stay at the high training complex, the opportunity was taken for fitness training and adjustment to the cooler temperatures.

World Championships: At the 37th World Championships in Tokyo, Japan, 28 April/9 May 1983, the NZ men's team failed to gain promotion when they lost to Luxembourg, 2-5, to come second in the section. After allowing for teams ranked above NZ at the previous world championships who did not enter this year, the NZ men did not improve their rating and remained at 37 out of a total of 57 teams making promotion to category 11 as elusive as ever.

In his managerial report, Nelson Tizard, wrote "Peter Jackson had a splendid international debut and showed his true potential in the contests with Spain and Dominican Republic when he played above himself at 4-4 to clinch a 5-4 win for New Zealand".

The women's team again had better results than the men, to gain three places for a good world rating of 23 out of a total of 47 teams. The doubles pairing of Christine Lee and Jan Morris, winning 73% of their matches, told the story of the improvement in the team placing.

Individual events: Barry Griffiths won his qualifying matches which included an extra good one when he beat the German Federal Republic team player, M. Plum 15-21, 17-21, 21-11, 21-11, 21-15. Griffiths, however, failed in his first round proper losing to another Griffiths (Wales), 21-14, 21-23, 15-21, 19-21. The other men players and Shelley Bougher failed to qualify. Christine Lee and Jan Morris both lost their first singles match played, although Christine exerted pressure on Eva Malmberg (Finland) before conceding the match at 15-21, 17-21, 21-15, 21-18, 13-21.

Biennial General Meeting: NZ was represented at the Biennial General Meeting of the International Table Tennis Federation by Nelson Tizard and Ron Menchi. Ken Wilkinson was also present as the ITTF Vice-President, Oceania Continent. Frank O'Gorman was credited as an 'observer' from New Zealand. The meeting agreed to a number of changes to the Laws of Table Tennis and to the regulations for international competitions. The changes, which take effect in New Zealand from 1 January, 1984 have been circulated to Associations. It is important that players, umpires and tournament officials are aware of and understand the new definitions particularly the one referring to the racket blade, the surfaces of which shall be of clearly different colours whether or not both sides are used for striking the ball.

Olympic Games: Table Tennis will be included in the programme of the 1988 Olympic Games to be held in Seoul, Korea.

Options for future world championships: 1985, Gothenburg, Sweden; 1987 New Delhi, India; 1989 England, Germany, Japan and USA all advised interest.

World Government: In accordance with an agreed rotation, Len Haycraft (Australia) serves as ITTF Vice-President, Oceania for 1983/85 and Ken Wilkinson (New Zealand) as a member of the ITTF Council for the same two-year term.

3. New Zealand Juniors in Australia: In the final team placings of the Australian Junior Championships held at the Macquarie University gymnasium, Marsfield, Sydney 15-20 May, 1983, the NZ boys were placed 2nd to Victoria and the girls 5th ahead of Western Australia and Tasmania. The boys lost their opening contest with South Australia 4-5 and then to Victoria 3-6 but on a count back squeezed out South Australia to take 2nd placing.

The team was led by Colin Alexander (Kapiti) as Manager with Paul Escott (Wellington) the Coach. The players were:-

"The objective of moulding team spirit and enthusiasm by each individual player to be playing to his or her full potential at the championships," was achieved, the Coach said.

The best results came from the combination of Tony Radford and Robert Kerr, and Eileen Hoete and Yvonne Cuthbert, in reaching the semi-finals of the under 17 boys and under 15 girls doubles respectively.

Eketahuna Club: Used as part of the pre-tour training, the boys' team together with Richard McGillivray (Hutt Valley) and the team Coach, Paul Escott, accepted an invitation to take part in the Eketahuna district community festival, playing matches and entertaining the public with their skills. In appreciation of the table tennis promotion effort, the Eketahuna Club made a donation of \$50 towards the travel expenses of the NZ junior team.

"Butterfly" equipment: The players wore "Butterfly" clothing and used "Butterfly" bats and rubbers, supplied to the team members through the courtesy and generosity of Tamasu & Co. Ltd, Japan, manufacturers of the world famous "Butterfly" table tennis equipment.

Reports: Two comprehensive reports submitted by the Team Manager and by the Coach have been circulated to all Associations and to the players concerned.

4. New Caledonia and Tahiti:

From 10th to 26th August, Richard Lee was in Tahiti at the invitation of the Ligue Polynesienne de Tennis de Table for a similar purpose of preparing the Tahiti team for the South Pacific Games. Richard was used as a 'sparring' partners for match play fitness and acted under the guidance of the French Coach Thierry Roesch.

5. 1983 Australian Open Championships:

18-year-old Gary Haberl added the Australian men's singles title to his NZ title when he beat Tommy Daniellson 3-2 in the final and joined a select few who have won both the NZ and Australian men's singles title in the same year.

Shelley Munday won the women's singles from Nadia Bisiach, 21-15, 21-14, 21-10. Gary Haberl and Ron Carlyle won the men's doubles while Mike Johns and Claire Maisey (UK) beat Gary Haberl and Denise Horder (nee Millikan) in the mixed.

Victoria won both the men's and women's teams events. Men's ranking 1 Haberl; 2 Daniellson; 3 Tuckett; 4 Javor.

6. World Cup Qualifying Tournament:

New Zealand will again stage a round robin tournament to decide the Oceania representative for the World Cup Tournament. The qualifying tournament will be held in the Upper Hutt Town Hall on Saturday 17 March, 1984 and be featured as part of the 50th Jubilee celebrations of the formation of the NZ Table Tennis Association. Australia will be represented by Gary Haberl and Tommy Daniellson and they will meet the New Zealand selection Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson.

7. 1984 Australian Junior Championships:

NZ teams will again compete in the teams and individual events of the Australian Junior Championships to be held in North Perth, Western Australia 19-24 May, 1984. The following selection has been announced:-

SWAYTHLING CLUB INTERNATIONAL - by Errol Cheal, the national representative of the Club in New Zealand

The Swaythling Club was formed in 1967 by Victor Barna and Zarko Dolinar. Originally it was a club to be devoted to reunions of table tennis champions and officials who have represented their country at world championships.

The amazing growth of table tennis has necessitated the club to become the Swaythling Club International. Exclusively, it now appears to enlarge its camaraderie to those whose service to their country in table tennis has become a dedicated, enjoyable way of life. Membership is by application through a country's representative.

Certainly members overseas enjoy many privileges from the hosts of leading international tournaments. Alan Tomlinson was the Japanese Association's guest at the 1983 World Championships.

The continuation of the growth of the Club has resulted in the Club taking over the organisation of the biannual Veteran Worlds' Championships. The first tournament was held in 1982 at Gothenburg, Sweden. It was pleasing to know that Phyllis Lauder (NZ's champion cheer leader overseas and club member) won the over 70 women's singles.

The 1984 Veteran World Championships run by the Club will be held in Helsinki, Finland. It will be an open championship with the 40-50-60-70 age groups.

The New Zealand members are - Errol Cheal (representative), Athol Attwood, Gary Frew, Alf Harding, James Morris, Dick Rassie, Neti Traill, Ken Wilkinson and Alan Tomlinson.

UMPIRING

Although there were requests for the supply of test papers, there was a fall

off in the number of test papers submitted for marking. Of the papers submitted, only Bryan Keane of the North Shore Association was successful. He later went on to pass the practical test to qualify as a provincial umpire as from 22 July, 1983.

The Alan and Edna McCallum Umpiring Trophies:

Fulfilling a recommendation of the NZTTA liaison officer, John Lelliott, after the 1982 NZ championships, Associations were invited to submit nominations of juniors who wished to be assessed for The Alan and Edna McCallum Umpiring Awards.

Nominations received were:

Boys: 14 from 8 Associations - average age 25
Girls: 15 from 8 Associations - average age 15 and youngest 12

As two Associations had submitted nominations of boys or girls only, the 29 juniors came from 10 districts out of the 27 affiliated to the NZTTA. The judges who assessed the excellence in the performance of umpiring matches, were Frank O'Gorman and Ivan Moffat. The 1983 winners were David Pyper (Hutt Valley) and Sandra Mayes (Nelson).

In his report, Frank O'Gorman listed the visible umpiring faults noticed during the five days' judging and these were:-

1. Umpires remaining seated for doubles - the ITTF Handbook recommends that an umpire stands for doubles;
2. Umpires resting their feet on the table supports;
3. Umpires not recording the name of the player who served first in the match and not recording the order of receiving in each game in a doubles;
4. Umpires not tossing a coin at the start of each match. The ITTF Handbook states that 'At the start of the match the choice of service and ends shall be determined by lot, usually by tossing a coin or a disc with two distinctive sides';
5. Umpires not raising their voice to a reasonable volume for the benefit of other members in each team and for the nearby supporters.

As a general observation, Mr O'Gorman noticed that in a number of cases the younger and possibly weaker players, were taking more than their share of umpiring and he added that umpiring duties should be shared between all members of a junior team.

Mr O'Gorman made a number of recommendations to stimulate greater interest in umpiring by juniors and these suggestions are being considered by the Umpires Committee.

History

At the instigation of Frank O'Gorman, two trophies were presented to commemorate the outstanding contribution made to table tennis by the late Alan Bruce McCallum and his wife Edna McCallum. The trophies are awarded to a boy and a girl under 18 years of age who excel in the performance of umpiring matches.

"Table Talk"

The 3rd issue of 'Table Talk' a newsletter for umpires, is expected to be available for distribution in December. The newsletter contains information about the changes to the Laws of Table Tennis and regulations for international competition, the latest ITTF list of approved rubbers and an updated list of active umpires.

International Umpire:

It is a directive of The International Table Tennis Federation that, for World Championships, at least 25% of the umpires must be international umpires from other countries and there are similar arrangements at many other major tournaments throughout the world. At the 37th World Championships at Tokyo, Japan, April/May 1983, two international umpires from Oceania were invited. The umpires were Keith Fraser (New Zealand) and Angelo Tabone (Australia). Keith Fraser thereby became New Zealand's first representative to umpire at a world championships. The two Oceania representatives, working as a pair, completed a busy umpiring schedule. Keith Fraser was later honoured by being allocated one of the women's singles quarter-final matches.

International Umpire Training Course

Gary Farquhar and Tony Darroch will be attending an international umpire training course to be held in Hong Kong from 26th to 31st December 1983. The course will prepare candidates for the 9th international umpire examination to be conducted in 1984.

This is the second training course hosted by the Hong Kong Association. The aim is to raise the umpiring standard in Hong Kong and Asia to the status of international level and to have sufficient numbers of qualified umpires who can be used at future international table tennis competitions held in Hong Kong and abroad.

The course will be conducted by Hans Giesecke, Secretary ITTF Rules Committee who also directed the first course in 1979. It is expected that representatives from eleven Associations from Asia and Oceania will accept the invitation to attend.

<u>NZ TABLE TENNIS DEVELOPMENT TRUST</u> - report by John Lelliott, convenor Trustees.	

In 1981/82, the first year of the Trust, 34 members joined and contributed \$755. This included 3 Associations and 3 clubs as well as 28 individuals. In 1982/83 4 members have not renewed their subscriptions, 1 has resigned and 2 passed away, 4 new members joined making a total membership of 31 who between them contributed \$585 a reduction of \$170 from the previous year. This is a most disappointing result and does not reflect, in my opinion, the number of true supporters of table tennis as I am sure, if we received the backing of all Associations we would soon lift the membership to ten times the current number. If we are going to develop table tennis in the same way that other sports in New Zealand are developing, assistance towards the cost of overseas training and experience for our top young players is essential. I would appeal to all Associations and Clubs to not only become members but to ask all current and former players in their district to join.

The only grant made by the Trust to 31 October, 1983 has been \$350 to Kadia Rice towards her trip to England, but it is hoped that a grant to another player will be made in the near future.

PERMANENT TROPHIES

We gratefully acknowledge the acceptance of three new trophies. They are -

- ** Dellaca Cup for the South Island secondary schools teams tournament;
- ** P.D.L. Cup for the South Island intermediate/primary schools teams tournament;
- ** Mid Canterbury Shield for the under 15 boys team 'C' grade of the NZ junior inter-association teams championships.

Trophies required

For the junior inter-association teams championships, shields are required for:

- under 18 boys team 'C' grade and for the girls teams 'B' and 'C' grades
- Under 15 boys and girls teams 'B' grade

The following specifications are provided for the donation of permanent shields -

- material to be of wood in the shape of a shield; not less than 400mm in length, 300mm in width and 10mm in thickness; title engraving to be discussed.

In the NZ individual junior championships, trophies are sought for the mixed doubles, under 12 years event, to complete the programme. For the North Island and South Island championships there are a variety of junior events

not yet provided*with a permanent trophy. Specifications for the donation of trophies are -

EPNS or better, plinth to be plastic or wood, total height of trophy and plinth to be not less than 30cm, height of plinth not less than 8mm, value of trophy to be not less than \$60 retail and title engraving of trophy to be discussed.

FINANCIAL REPORT by Dick Lynn, ACA, Treasurer

Some improvement was shown in the financial position under review in 1983. Though the Association carried out the same activities on a slightly small scale than last year, the costs incurred in carrying out these activities were much reduced. A reasonable profit was enjoyed.

The sending of a NZ team to the Commonwealth and World Championships, the sending of a NZ junior team to Australia, and a coaching programme consisting of two national coaching schools and three regional coaching schools were the main events of the year. The Association received assistance for all three events. For the World's, contributions of \$8,000 were received from the players, manager and coach and sponsorship of \$6,280 from Government funds. For the Junior tour, contributions of \$4,000 were received from the players, manager and coach and sponsorship from Alexander's Home Decor Ltd. The coaching programme received a grant of \$5,000 from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport.

A grant of \$6,336 was received from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport to offset administration costs of \$20,670 which are comparable with \$20,739 last year. The net costs of the two tours were \$4,975 which is well down on \$9,634 for two tours to Australia last year. However, the real recovery is in the coaching area.


Income this year rose by \$1,000 mainly due to the increase in affiliation fees from \$16,696 to \$20,827. This offset the fact that no raffle was held in 1983. The raffle is scheduled for March 1984 which hopefully will be a better selling period.

Net working capital has recovered this year from \$6,500 to \$10,500 arresting a 3-year decline pattern. The Association also has been able to invest \$20,000 on term deposit with Westpac Banking Corporation. This represents the 1984 Ministry of Recreation and Sport's grant received early and the Coaching Levy imposed on Associations this year.

New features in this year's accounts are the Overseas Coach Fund and Jubilee Fund statements. A levy of \$1 per financial affiliated member was charged to each Association. This raised \$7,632 in 1983. To this fund the Executive has approved a transfer from general funds of \$1,500, the 'Nittaku' ball sponsorship, to be added to the levy, making a balance of \$9,132.

The Executive also approved a grant of \$500 from general funds to cover the 1984 'Jubilee' expenses.

In 1984, we expect the financial position to improve. Normal income should increase by 5% to \$25,000, due to a resolution passed at the 1983 Annual General Meeting, adding the increase in the annual cost of living index to 30 September, to affiliation fees. Normal operating expenses should remain at about \$21,000. A coaching levy of \$1.05 per association member should raise \$7,000 for the Overseas Coach Fund while we expect the raffle for 1984 to

bring in \$10,000 to cover several ventures proposed. These include the 'Oceania' elimination match in March, the junior's tour to Perth, cost of overseas players participating in the NZ 'Golden Jubilee' championships and the Oceania championships in New Caledonia.

The success of the raffle is vital. NZ need \$10,000 each year in fund-raising to finance overseas tours and thus reduce players' contributions.

Finally, the raffle can bring \$24,000 to provincial associations to meet their needs.



**** JOHN WILLIAM ANDREWS who died at the Hutt Hospital on 27th June, 1985 in his 93rd year. In the years gone by, Jack Andrews and his Hutt Valley joinery firm, were experts at making table tennis tables. Jack gave us good advice about the best timbers and paints to provide first class table tennis tables. His memory is perpetuated with the 'J.W. Andrews Cups' for the N.Z. Boys singles under 16 years.

**** THOMAS STAFFORD WILLIAMS, 83, died at the Home of Compassion, Wellington on Wednesday 6th July, 1983. Wellington Table Tennis and New Zealand Table Tennis are symbolic of the name of Tommy Williams. He established the Wellington Association in 1933 and for 25 years he was Chairman of the Management Committee. He called the first meeting which led to the formation of the N.Z. Association in 1934. Without their personal efforts, table tennis would not fare as well for publicity. A tribute is also paid to Association secretaries and committee members for the enthusiasm displayed in the control and management of the activities of their Association.

The general accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of the financial position under this historical cost method have been used.


Depreciation
