New Zealand Lottery

Through the efforts of President Barry Butler, sufficient tickets were ordered and sold to give associations a reasonable profit. The inclusion of a car as first prize has meant that the value of the prizes as a percentage of sales is almost double the minimum requirements. A sub-committee has recommended that the prize list and value be changed to achieve a better result even with the sale of a reduced number of tickets.

Association Awards

The National Council agreed that awards be made to associations for significant achievement. Nominations were to be made by Regional Councillors. Three associations were nominated and congratulations are extended to:

- ☺ South Canterbury, for their achievements in the area of Kiwi Table Tennis.
- ☺ Southland, for a significant increase in membership through new activities.

Regional Councillors

Regretfully, because of ill health, Malcolm Temperley resigned as the Region 1 Councillor. Derek Sims was elected to the position on 27 August for the balance of the current term and for 1994.

Racket Covering Adhesives

The ITTF has ruled that for open international championships and world title events the use of liquid glue to attach racket coverings to blades will be banned from 1 June 1994.

At the Oceania Federation meeting NZTTA proposed that the ban on the use of liquid adhesives be implemented in the Oceania Region from 1 January 1994, but because the World Veterans championships would be held in Australia in April, it was agreed that the ban become effective from 1 June, 1994.

In the lead up to the ban on liquid adhesives, the ITTF had issued a list of approved glues which did not contain the toxic substances which were a health hazard. It was unfortunate that none of the listed glues were readily available in New Zealand so not all players had access to them and were therefore placed at a disadvantage.

The Waikato Association, in conjunction with the University of Waikato, developed a method of detecting the use of banned solvents. Nine rackets were tested during the North Island Championships with one testing positive and one marginal.

The Waikato Association is commended on their initiative in setting up the testing procedures. The facility was also available (but not used) for the New Zealand Championships in Auckland.

The National Council has decided that the ban on the use of all liquid adhesives for fixing racket covers to blades will become effective from 1 May, 1994. From this date it will be mandatory for competitors entering the North Island, South Island and New Zealand Championships to have their racket coverings affixed to the blade with double sided adhesive tape or they may use racket coverings which have a pressure-sensitive adhesive. Players not competing in these championships are required to use double sided tape or pressure-sensitive racket coverings when they remove or replace their existing racket coverings.

Visits to Associations

President Barry Butler and Executive Director Merv Allardyce visited Hutt Valley, Wairarapa, Hawkes Bay, Wanganui and Manawatu. These were very well worthwhile visits which covered a large range of topics such as development, NZ Lottery, coaching, local Recreation and Sport funding scheme, training camps, Kiwi Table Tennis, and NZTTA administration costs.

Ball Research Project

As reported in 1992, this project will research the learning curve for beginner players using balls of different sizes, and how learning is transferred to a standard ball.

The Sport Science and Technology Board has made a grant available and the project will be supervised by Professor Les Williams, the Dean of the Physical Education Faculty at Otago University. The testing equipment and computer software are being set up and the project should commence in 1994.

NZTTA Office Premises

On 13 January, 1993, the national sports offices situated in the Dominion Building plus some additional national sports moved to new premises in the Wellington Civic Library building. The attraction of this building was a guaranteed tenure of ten years and the maximum rental payable at the review dates was established before the move.

In Brief

- \*\*\* The Smokefree TV Sports Series is sponsored by NZ on Air, TVNZ and the NZ Sports Assembly. It is designed to give lower profile sports some television exposure. The table tennis segment this year was taken from the Auckland Open Championships.
- \*\*\* Rating system - An evaluation of the ITTF system is currently taking place with a view to adopting the system for New Zealand.
- \*\*\* Australian Table Tennis Magazine - The Australian TTA produces a good quality magazine which is published four times per year. Arrangements have been made for NZTTA to contribute articles for the magazine and to distribute the magazine in New Zealand. It is also proposed that a New Zealand supplement be included with each issue.

COACHING PROGRAMME

Because of pressure of work Peter Hirst resigned as Director of Coaching and Convenor of Selectors. His professional expertise will not be lost. He is available to accept the role of consultant on coaching matters and will undertake specific tasks such as the Ball Research project.

The overall coaching programme, for several reasons, was not quite as well organised as would have been desirable.

A more structured coaching plan has been prepared and the draft proposals circulated to associations and coaches for comment. It provides for the setting up of Area Committees and the appointment of an Area Coaching Co-ordinator and Area Coach in each of the three designated Areas.

The National Council has approved the plan and the structure, and staff appointments should be in place before Christmas.

Coach Education Programme

The Coach Education Programme was made possible through subsidised funding from the Hillary Commission. As was the case in 1992, our thrust was to increase the number of coaches with particular emphasis on school teachers to give them the skills to introduce Kiwi Table Tennis to their students.

The question is sometimes asked why the emphasis in this programme is on schools. The answer is that the Hillary Commission provides subsidised grant-aid funding to train coaches and it is the responsibility of the sports to train their players.

Our targets for 1993 were 470 club coaches/school teachers and 500 tertiary students. Whilst it is disappointing to record that only ten associations furnished reports, the good news is that seven associations achieved 415 coaches and teachers. Congratulations are extended to Northland, Auckland, Hawkes Bay, Wanganui, Manawatu, South Canterbury and Southland associations for their achievements in 1993.

Because of the change of the date of the annual meeting this report has been finalised three months earlier so it is not possible to make valid comparisons with previous years. As an example, the seminars for Colleges of Education have not yet been completed.

Barry Wynks is the NZTTA representative with the Hillary Commission KiwiSport programme and we record our appreciation to him.

The Kiwi Table Tennis manual and video have been completed and both are readily available from NZTTA office and Waikato Education Centre. NZTTA received grants totalling \$12,400 from the Hillary Commission towards the costs of both projects.

National Training Camps

Two camps were held:

HILLARY COMMISSION FOR SPORT, FITNESS AND LEISURE

For our 1993 programme we received grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission totalling \$57,720. The amount received was based on the objectives and priorities outlined in the NZTTA management plan which had been submitted to and discussed with the Commission.

We are grateful to the Hillary Commission for their financial assistance. We also record our appreciation to the staff of the Commission, especially our Liaison Manager Paul Tredinnick, whose advice and assistance has always been readily available.

The Commission has advised that the level of grant-aid funding for 1994 will be \$58,000. It is relevant to note that other initiatives were declined with the comment that the amount approved was, in the opinion of the Commission, an appropriate funding level for table tennis. Effectively what they are saying is that the level of revenue from our own sources (eg affiliation fees) needs to be increased to justify an increased level of grants from the Commission.

Sportfit

Sportfit is a Hillary Commission programme about increasing participation in secondary school sport. It is also about improving the quality of sports education programmes for the benefit of all secondary school students.

Information on how associations could link in with the programme was circulated at the beginning of the year. It is not certain how many associations took the opportunity.

It is appropriate to note that data from the Hillary Commission's "Life in New Zealand" survey showed almost identical responses from male and female teenagers (aged 15-18) about the reasons why they become involved in sport:

NATIONAL TYPE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Having been trialled in the open and C grade men's and women's singles at the 1992 NZ Championships, round robin singles group play was implemented at the 1993 South Island, North Island and New Zealand Championships.

The opportunity was taken to vary the method of making the post-section draws. As an example at the South Island Championships two players from each group advanced to the post-section draw; at the North Island two players advanced if there were eight or less groups, otherwise only the winner advanced; and at the NZ Championships two players from each group advanced only where there were four groups or less.

The format of the teams events, apart from the under 19 and under 15 girls, had the top four teams in one round robin (to establish the seeding order for the post-section knock-out) and the balance of the teams in an appropriate number of other round robins with the winner of each of those groups joining teams in the first group for the post-section knock-out. The balance of the teams played in another knock-out for B grade. In the men's event eight teams contested B grade and a further four played a round robin to determine C grade.

Arising from the experiences of the various 1993 championships were a number of issues which are currently being considered by the Tournament Play sub-committee.

The Annual General Meeting held in March, 1992, agreed in principle to separate tournaments for senior, junior and veterans at the North Island, South Island and New Zealand Championships. It is relevant to note that although Waikato and Auckland associations applied for one championship they both hosted an additional two and one respectively. This raises the question why more associations do not apply to take a turn at hosting a national type championship given the fact that they could be held in smaller venues. We can only reflect on possible reasons which could include a shortage of persons to run them and the lack of necessary expertise. The NZ Veterans Championships in Timaru illustrated that with the use of computer technology the number of staff can be kept to a minimum. The format used at the NZ Championships in Auckland demonstrated that a larger staff was only needed for a relatively short time. On the question of expertise, a good case could be developed for a small, experienced team to actually run the championships with local volunteers as back-ups.

OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

A general meeting of the Federation was held during the 6th Oceania Championships held in Melbourne on 12-15 August.

Matters of interest which arose from that meeting were:

- \*\*\* There are now ten countries affiliated to the Federation. This is significant as allocations by the ITTF of profits from Olympic Games are made to the Continental zones based on the number of members in each zone.
- \*\*\* The meeting agreed that the use of liquid adhesives for fixing racket coverings to blades be banned within the Federation from 1 June, 1994.
- \*\*\* A proposal that there be a common umpires qualification for all Oceania countries.
- \*\*\* National Olympic Solidarity Courses were held in Guam and Papua New Guinea.
- \*\*\* The 7th Oceania Championships would be hosted in Tahiti on 7-13 May, 1994.
- \*\*\* The decision was made to appoint a Development Officer to promote table tennis in the Island member countries.
- \*\*\* Geoff Rau succeeded Ken Wilkinson as President of the Federation. A tribute to Ken Wilkinson appears elsewhere in this report.
- \*\*\* Philip Males (Australia) was elected Executive Director.

NZ SPORTS ASSEMBLY

The membership of the NZ Sport Assembly includes 108 national sports organisations, which in turn represent a total of 1.4 million sports members.

An important function of the Assembly is to monitor Government measures which could have an adverse impact on sport.

Legislation which has been the subject of submissions from the Assembly includes the Accident Compensation and Rehabilitation Act, Liquor Sponsorships and Liquor Brand Advertising Codes, Gaming Machines, Entertainment Tax, Fringe Benefit Tax, Human Rights legislation, Smoke-Free Environment Act No.2, Resource Management Act.

PLAYER OF YEAR AWARD

PETER JACKSON (Auckland) was named the 1993 Player of the Year.

Peter has a current world ranking of 151, and represented Oceania at the 1993 World Cup and World Doubles Cup.

JUNIOR OF YEAR AWARD

The 1993 Junior of the Year and the winner of the H N Ballinger Cup was RACHAEL HOOPER.

The criteria used in awarding this cup cover sportsmanship, potential, dress, personality, enthusiasm, interest in club and/or association management affairs, and playing results.

JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR - RUSSELL DICKEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy is awarded to that junior player who has brought the most credit to New Zealand table tennis taking into account performance, behaviour, neatness of presentation, co-operation and team spirit. The award can be won only once by any player.

The winner for 1993 was TRACEY PHILLIPS (Otago)

TRIBUTE TO KEN WILKINSON BEM

It is now eight years since Ken Wilkinson retired after 36 years service to NZTTA so it is understandable that some people may wonder who this man is.

In the 1991 Annual Report a tribute was paid to Ken Wilkinson on his retirement as an Officer of the ITTF. At the General Meeting of the Oceania Federation held in Melbourne in August Ken did not seek re-election as President of the Federation. In 1978 through the foresight of Ken and Keith Bowler (Australia), the Oceania Table Tennis Federation was born with Ken as its founding President - a position he held until the general meeting in Melbourne in August this year.

For his services to table tennis Ken has been honoured with the following awards:

During his involvement in table tennis, Ken developed a network of contacts throughout the world and he maintained a very lively interest in how table tennis could be made better; how the sport could be better promoted; how it could be made more attractive for players and spectators; how to increase the number playing.

Thank you, Ken, for your marvellous contribution to table tennis at national and international levels. You are of a rare breed of sports administrators who by their wholehearted dedication have made a real impact on their chosen sport. All those who know you will wish you a long and peaceful retirement.

We record with sadness the deaths of table tennis administrators and players, who by their dedication, made a very significant contribution to the development of table tennis in New Zealand.

Gleniti Tavern 7th NZ Veterans Championships

The first "event" was a barbecue/champagne breakfast - at no cost to the players. The friendly atmosphere at this early gathering set the tone for the tournament.

The use of TV monitors in association with a personal computer reduced the staffing requirements of a traditional semaphore board.

The championships were under the control of a young team of three persons. Roger Bennett, Michael Fox and Tracey O'Connell are congratulated on a fine effort.

#### South Island Championships

These championships comprised senior and junior events and were the first at which all the singles events were played on a round robin basis, with post-section knockouts. The number of individual entries was a five year high (and 50% up on 1992).

This posed the organising committee with quite a challenge as, among other things, they had to make variations to the original timetable as published in the entry form.

Despite all the challenges the championships were only a couple of hours behind schedule at the end. The committee are to be congratulated on coping so well and running a good tournament.

#### North Island Championships

Originally, Waikato applied for and were allocated the North Island junior championships, but when no other associations applied for the senior and veterans championships Waikato agreed to include them in their programme.

A higher entry than in 1992 and sectional round robin singles made for a very busy tournament.

In his report, David Jackson (the NZTTA Liaison Officer) commented: "The Waikato officials should be well pleased with their efforts. Many problems they tackled bravely and all were dealt with quickly and fairly. They were a pleasure to work with."

Although not part of the championships, an innovation was the holding of junior age group teams events on the two days prior to the championships. The intent of these events was to give experience to players who were on the fringe of selection for their association teams. Congratulations, Waikato, on trying something different.

#### Prospect of Howick Senior and Papakura Toyota Junior New Zealand Championships

Originally, the Auckland Association had applied for and been allocated the junior championships and when it was evident that another association was not going to apply to host the senior events Auckland agreed to include them as long as the whole programme could be completed in the same time frame as had been planned for the junior championships.

Because of the larger numbers of teams entries as compared with 1992 it was possible to introduce the new playing format in all teams championships except the Under 19 and Under 15 girls. Contests this year comprised six singles and one doubles match. Associations were required to list their team members in merit order and to play in that order throughout the teams events. There were a couple of instances where the nominated orders were suspect and another two or three instances of contests being played with players playing out of order. It was noticeable that only one association took full advantage of the chance to enter second teams.

For the round robin section of the singles events each group was allocated a table and result sheet

which set out the order of play and umpiring. Each group was allocated two and a half hours to complete their matches. This system worked very well for all the singles events. As a result a very small management team was needed from the start of the teams events to the completion of the singles round robins.

The post-section singles draws were done in public and there was a lot of interest in some of the draws.

Auckland has conducted more than their share of national type championships in recent years with the same management team and this has resulted in a high degree of professionalism in their organisation. They are congratulated on a well run tournament.

#### Schools Teams Championships

The three school teams championships were each held in three stages - association, regional and New Zealand finals.

Both the secondary schools finals were held just prior to the commencement of the NZ Junior championships to save the costs of travel to a different venue at a different time. We express appreciation to Waitemata Association for hosting these two finals and arranging billets.

The primary/intermediate finals were hosted by South Canterbury and we are grateful to them for hosting the event and providing billets for the visiting players.

All six regions were represented in the secondary open finals; four in the secondary girls, and three in the primary/intermediate. In the case of the latter championships some associations have made a conscious decision to limit their involvement to establishing a regional winner.

A summary of the results is on pages 42/43.

#### The Aotearoa Maori Table Tennis Championships

These championships, outside the jurisdiction of the NZTTA, were held in the Auckland area on 23-24 October and catered for players of Maori and Polynesian descent.

The NZ Maori Table Tennis Championships were a regular fixture up to about 20 years ago.

Congratulations are extended to the organisers and the hope is expressed that the championships will again be an annual event.

### INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

The period under review saw a record number of players competing in tournaments overseas.

#### Asian Senior Championships

These championships were held in New Delhi, India, 7-14 November, 1992. New Zealand was represented by a women's team. Each of the players contributed \$2,170.

The results are listed on page 44.

#### 1992 World Doubles Cups

These events were held in Las Vegas, USA on 15-20 December, 1992. In the men's event Oceania was represented by Peter Jackson and Hagen Eower, and the women's event by Australia's Ying Kwok and Kerri Tepper.

Peter and Hagen faced strong pairings from Europe and China and were unsuccessful in progressing beyond group play.

#### Training Tour to China

Resulting from an approach by Zhu Hui with an offer to accompany a group of players to train in China, associations were invited to submit the names of players interested in spending a month in China during the Christmas, 1992 period. The following sixteen players participated in the tour:

Tony Chan, Lisa Mitchell (Auckland), Rachael Hooper, Mark Stuart (Northland), John Halliday (Counties), Stuart Jones, Graham Miller (Waikato), Stacey Hooper, Thomas Hovey, Jared Smith, Larr Sweeney (Wanganui), Paul Brown, Ben Lindstrom, Howard White (Hutt Valley), Simon Linyard, Robert Morrison (South Canterbury).

We are grateful to Zhu Hui for making his offer. In his report he commented: "Overall, I believe the trip was a worthwhile educational experience for our young players. They coped well with Chinese culture and customs and made friends."

The travel arrangements were co-ordinated by the NZTTA office. The cost of travel, accommodation and meals was \$3,508 per player.

#### Development Tour to Malaysia

An approach was made to the Malaysian Table Tennis Association for a group of New Zealand players to train with and compete against their players. The players selected for the tour were Daniel Hempstead, Sarah Finch (Waikato), Melanie Low (Auckland), Raewyn Young (Hutt Valley), Simon Fenwick (Canterbury), Tracey Phillips, Ben Duffy (Otago). One player withdrew too late for a replacement to be arranged. The team was accompanied by Martin Duffy and Murray Finch. The basic cost of travel, accommodation and meals was \$2,117 per player.

#### 42nd World Championships

These championships were held in Gothenburg, Sweden.

The players from New Zealand met up with the European based players in Brussels where the final preparations were made. With the ban on selected glues, rackets were tested during the championships. In his report David Jackson commented:

"The spectacle of players wearing plain white to multi-coloured uniforms against blue tables and nets, orange balls and wine-red floors has now become commonplace for international table tennis. In the main stadium where all the top teams played there were electronic digital scoring systems in use."

David reported: "The men gained 43rd place being four places lower than two years earlier. However, there were seven new countries ahead of them so this could be considered an improvement of three positions. The women finished in 59th place which was higher than expected and a creditable performance for this inexperienced team."

The basic cost to the players who departed from New Zealand was \$2,463 each after allowing for a subsidy of \$700 from NZTTA.

The results are recorded on pages 45/46.

#### Australian U15 and U17 Championships

The 1993 championships were held in Canberra and New Zealand was represented by girls and boys teams in each age category.

The basic cost to each player was \$1,163

The results are listed on page 47.

For many players these championships are the introduction to international table tennis. Emphasis is placed on the players doing the right things such as spinning the ball in the first phase of the rally; getting in but not necessarily first; taking the ball as early as comfortably possible, and using the six basic tactical plays.

#### 4th International Tournament of Noumea

An invitation was received from New Caledonia to send a team of two males and one female to this tournament accompanied by one official. The host country provided full hospitality and a grant towards the cost of the airfares. We are grateful to the Ligue Caledonienne de Tennis de Table for the invitation and hospitality.

The teams event comprised teams of two males and one female and each contest comprised four men's singles, one women's singles, one men's doubles and one mixed doubles. The results are summarised on page 48.

We had been advised that the France No 1 team, which included World Champion Jean Philippe Gatién, would compete so an approach was made to the French TT Federation for them to play a contest in Auckland after the Noumea tournament. Due to a tight schedule, the French Federation declined our request.

#### 6th Oceania Championships

These championships were originally scheduled to have been hosted in 1992 by Papua New Guinea and when they were unable to do so Australia offered to host them as long as competing associations paid their own costs. Previous championships have covered senior teams and individual events only but with the introduction of the Global Youth Championships, events for Under 20, Under 17 and Under 14 were included to be qualifying events to determine the Oceania representatives at the Global Youth Championships.

Congratulations are extended to Paul Innes (Waikato) and Clara So (North Harbour) who won the respective Under 14 boys and girls singles to qualify for the Global Youth Championships. Regrettably, advice was subsequently received from the ITTF that the Under 14 events had been deleted from the Global Youth Championships programme.

Due to the additional events, the total New Zealand party totalled 30 players and 5 officials.

The basic cost to players was \$938 which included transport, accommodation and meals.

The results are listed on pages 49/50.

#### 1993 Heineken World Cup

This event is a men's singles tournament and Oceania was represented by Peter Jackson. It was held in China on 19-22 August.

Peter was drawn in the same group as 1992 Olympic Champion, Jan-Ove Waldner (Sweden) and didn't progress beyond group play.

#### 1994 International Programme: The 7th Worlds Veterans Championships

These championships will be hosted in Melbourne 22-27 April, 1994. Congratulations are extended to the Australian Table Tennis Association on winning the right to host them. It is expected that a large number of New Zealand veterans will take the opportunity to experience the atmosphere of a world championship.

The National Executive Director of the Australian TTA, Rod Lindroth, visited New Zealand in April to promote the event and there is to be a follow-up visit in November.

#### CONCLUSION

The potential market for table tennis is almost untapped. In addition to our traditional market, there are opportunities to promote the sport in a wide range of other areas: older adults and disabled persons for example. The challenge for table tennis is to take advantage of those opportunities. Not only will we be sharing the sport with others, but we will increase the numbers of affiliated players and strengthen our collective financial base.

The relationships between the Management Committee, National Council and Associations should be that of a partnership with each, through their different functions, making their contribution to the success of the partnership. Each member of the partnership needs to plan to make things happen. The essential ingredient is planning. "Plan the work, and work the plan".

TREASURER'S REPORT

At the last annual general meeting the annual balance date was changed to 30 September so this report covers a period of 11 months.

Although the accompanying financial reports suggest otherwise, the Association has completed the period under review in a sound position.

Income received from association allocations and from the Hillary Commission was complemented by revenue from a number of sources including various tournaments, interest, royalties and sales of stock items.

The change in accounting policy introduced in the previous financial year, and which resulted in accounts receivable at the end of the year being reported as having been received and included in 'excess income', has been reflected in an operating loss of \$5,940 for the review year.

As has been customary in recent years, activity in the form of overseas tours (funded largely by the players themselves) has included grants to the non-playing captains.

National training camps (three) were again subsidised.

Several grants totalling \$83,749 were received from the Hillary Commission for the following purposes:

General grant as per funding application	\$57,720
Grant in respect of the Ball Research Project	13,641
Grants towards cost of Coaching Video	12,388

Income from allocations to associations (determined by the respective regions) and revenue from championships brought in \$71,554; association fees outstanding at the end of the previous year have not been included.

For 1994, the Hillary Commission has confirmed that our grant will be \$58,000; an amount not expected to increase without the current level of allocations to district associations also increasing.

A total of \$41,000 has been tagged for administrative costs in the National Office. That amount is expected to be matched by at least a further \$28,000 from association funds.

The Hillary Commission grant also provides \$10,000 for coach education, \$4,000 for coaching in general, and \$3,000 for the travel costs of the ITTF vice president. Each of these amounts must be matched by similar contributions from association or other funds.
