- Only registered members of TTNZ and players affiliated to ITTF member countries are eligible. TTNZ members **must** quote their membership number on their entry form.
- Eligibility for age-group events is determined by age as at 31.12.02 for Under 21 – Under 13 and as at 31.12.03 for Over 35 – Over 60. Proof of age may be required.
- Eligibility for B grade: players below 25 on last rating list published prior to the close of entries.
- Eligibility for C grade: men below 100, women below 60 on the same rating list.
- Eligibility for D grade: men below 200, women below 100 on the same rating list
- TTNZ reserves the right to accept or reject entries in B, C & D grade from players who do not appear on the rating list.

ENTRIES

- Envelopes containing entries must be postmarked no later than the closing date and arrive at TTNZ no later than 7 days after the closing date.
- Entries must be accompanied by the correct fees. TTNZ reserves the right to impose a penalty for late payments. Fees are refundable if advice of a withdrawal is received by TTNZ within 14 days of the closing date.
- In addition to open, graded, and Under 21 events, no player may enter more than two age categories which must be consecutive (ie, Under 15 and Under 17, or Over 40 and Over 50, etc).
- No player may enter all three of the B, C & D grade categories but may enter any consecutive two (i.e. B and C, C and D, but not B and D).
- No player may enter more than eleven events in total.
- TTNZ reserves the right to refuse any entry and to vary restrictions at its discretion.
- Both players in any doubles pairing must submit separate individual entries for the same doubles event.
