MAJOR TOURNAMENTS

The South Island Championships will be held in Nelson from 14-16 June with entries closing on 21 May. There are still cheaper Air Fares available but accommodation is difficult to obtain if you want accommodation check with your local Association who will have details provided by the Nelson Association.

The North Island Championships will be held in Palmerston North from 28-30 June with entries closing on 5 June.

The National Championships will be held in Auckland from 2-14 Sept. The North Vs South Match is on Sunday 8 September; the Over 40 Teams Monday to Wednesday 9-11 Sept. and Veterans Individual events are Thursday to Saturday 12-14 Sept.

This year a new system of Veterans Ratings has been introduced and apart from the New Zealand Veterans at Easter there will be one Over 40 Rating Tournament in each Region as follows:

Region 1 - North Harbour May 25. Region 2 - Counties August 3.

Region 3 - Wanganui April 27. Region 4 - Wairarapa May 25.

Region 6 - South Cant. July 20. Region 5 - Marlborough May 4.

1991 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS AND MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS

These two tournaments will be held together at the Brisbane Table Tennis Stadium from Saturday 12 to Friday 18 October. The tentative programme is as follows:

VETERANS: Saturday 12 - Welcome Evening. Sunday 13 - Teams all day.

Mon. to Wed. 14-16 - Teams morning and afternoon.

Thurs.& Frid. 17-18 - Individual events.

Saturday 19 - Presentation and Social Evening.

MASTERS GAMES: Mon.& Tues.evenings 14-15 - Singles. Wed. evening 16 - Doubles.

A number of players have already decided to attend and accommodation is being arranged. Several others who are interested in going still haven't made their minds up and I would like to hear from them if they decide to go. A number of entry forms are available for the Masters Games and these will be sent to those who have indicated an interest in going. Those who enter after 30 June will have to pay an extra \$10(Australian).

MEMBERSHIP - Eleven new members joined at the Veterans Championships at Easter bringing the total to 104. However, a few didn't pay last year so the current membership is 96. Those who haven't paid this years subscription of \$3 can pay at the South or North Island Champs. or if not going can send it by post.

If any of you have any matters you wish to bring to the attention of other members please let me know by early July.

VETERANS MEETING

There was some difficulty fitting in the Annual Meeting because of the tight timetable mainly causedby the inclusion of the Special Singles Events. As a result there were only about 40 of the players present as many of them were taking a tea break. This meant that we couldn't be sure that all of the opinions expressed were what the majority of veterans wanted so perhaps we should consider sending out a form to all our members to get their opinions in writing. The main items discussed were as follows:

 $\frac{\text{Special Singles}}{\text{main tournament}}$, preferably after all other events were finished because of the difference between the bats and balls used. There didn't appear to be much support for these events being held in future years.

Tournament Date - It was suggested the timing be changed and held at a different time from Easter in alternative years. However, a big majority preferred the Tournament to be held at Easter.

Age Groups - It was brought up that agreement was reached at the $\overline{1990}$ meeting that over 65 events be introduced but this had been ignored although it should have been given priority over the Special Singles events. It was also suggested that instead of limiting entries to 2 age groups it should be changed to six events which would be a fairer system as all players couldn't get doubles partners and in particular a small percentage of males had mixed doubles partners.

Name of Tournament: The matter was raised again about the name Masters being used instead of Veterans, however, the majority favoured the name Veterans as a separate Masters Games was held every 2 years (Masters isn't really a suitable name for both sexes).

Medals: Disappointment was expressed that Medals were not being presented for B and C Grade singles. It was pointed out that with Round Robin Groups in the singles the lower grades were actually Consolation events and Medals weren't justified. Those who spoke appeared to disagree on this matter and there was no real consensus of opinion.

Organisation: Some disatisfaction was expressed at the way the NZTTA organised matters such as the Draw and Seedings and it was suggested that a separate Veterans Sub-Committee be set up and take over the organisation separate from but under the auspices of the NZTTA. There was general agreement with this proposal.

5th NEW ZEALAND VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Congratulations to the Hamilton Assn. (since changed to Waikato) for a well run Tournament with very good Catering and other facilities. The Organising Committee had four long hard days work and the Tournament Manager was always available to sort out any problems, although I'm sure he didn't have many to deal with as the friendly atmosphere that we get at Veterans Tournaments was very enjoyable, It was great to see the two 1934 Mens Singles Finalists, Errol Cheal and Frank Paton, participating perhaps we'll have Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson in 2050. Fortunately the concrete floor never got slippery and caused no problems thanks to the good timing. Teams Results:

SIXTH VETERANS WORLD TABLE TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Well we now have some good news for those of you with Irish Ancestry such as Pat McArthur (the name seems right), Christine Cunningham (hair colour looks Irish) also a couple of other Pat's and about 5 other Mc's are on the membership list. You are all invited to participate in the 6th Veterans World Championships to be held in Dublin from Monday 15 June to Saturday 20 June, 1992 There will be 5 Age Groups - Over 40's, 50's, 60's, 70's and 80's and eligibility is based on the year that you reach the age, for example Over 50's must have been born in 1942 or earlier. Entries are restricted to one singles and one doubles event with an entry fee of 30 Pounds (about \$90), this will include each competitor receiving a Badge of the World Championships, tickets for all sessions and a Programme with the Draw plus a Diploma of Participation in the Veterans World Table Tennis Championships. The equipment will be Joola Tables and Nittaku 3 Star Balls. In each event there will be round robins in groups of four with the top two going into the main Draw and the bottom two into the Consolation Draw. means that even if you lose every match you are still guaranteed a minimum of 4 singles and 4 doubles.

If any of you are interested in going please let me know as I will be following up to get full information on travel and accommodation. I'm seriously thinking of going to combine it with a visit to relatives in England.

Matters of Interest to Veterans

In the last Newsletter I mentioned the possibility of doing a survey of all members on matters discussed at the Hamilton meeting. The response I have had has been in favour of this and I have also been asked to include a few other items. I'll go through them all briefly and then enclose a separate sheet for completion and return to me by Mid-August and you'll get a summary in the next Newsletter in September.

- 1. Medals for Lower Grades Consider whether the B and C Grades should be regarded as Consolation Events or be given the same status as A Grade and be given Medals.
- Special Singles (with pimples out rubber) Do you think these should be held in future years or players be given the choice of entering other events instead.
- 3. Date of Tournament Should it continue to be held at Easter or at some other time. A big majority at the meeting preferred Easter.
- 4. Age Groups Consider the introduction of Over 65's as agreed at the 1990 meeting.
- 5. Organisation The question was raised as to whether a separate Veterans Sub-Committee should be set up to oversee the Seedings and the Draws as the way this has been carried out in the last two years was of concern to many players.
- 6. Limit on Entries Should there be a restriction on entries to only 2 Age Groups or the players be given more flexibility by the restriction being to 6 events.
- 7. Entry Fees most players consider the entry fees to be too high as they are well above other Tournaments and close to the entry fee for the Mens and Womens Open Singles at the National Championships and well above the Senior Age Groups at the Nationals. This year they were \$11.50 for Singles and \$7.30 for Doubles which is far too high particularly for Over 70's who get very few matches.
- 8. Teams Originally this was for Association Teams but now a Combined Team or an Overseas Team may win any event something which is not allowed in Australia or at our National Championships. 9. Ratings - A Veterans Rating system for Over 40's was introduced
- this year when most Tournaments have Over 45's and we do have a separate Merit Ratings for the Easter Tournament. Should we make it Over 45's or change the Age Groups to Over 40's, 50's and 60's at the Open Tournaments and perhaps have Ratings for two Age Groups

the same as they do for the Juniors.

10. Structure of Major Tournaments - Some statements have been made that the Veterans Events at the Nationals, North and South Island Championships are to be done away with. This is incorrect as the matter is under consideration by a National Sub-Committee and it is intended that any recommendation from the National Council go to the N.Z. Annual General Meeting and be dealt with in a democratic manner by votes from Associations. Most of the Veterans I have spoken to strongly oppose any deletion of Veterans Events at these major Tournaments.

NEW ZEALAND MASTERS GAMES

There will now be a New Zealand Masters Games in 1992 for about 40 different sports, including Table Tennis. It will be held in Dunedin from 3rd to 9th February, if anybody is interested in taking part write to N.Z.Masters Games, P.O.Box58-485, Dunedin and they will send you up to date information. It is expected that there will be both Teams and Individual Events for Over 35's, 45's and 55's plus an individual event for Over 65's. It will be repeated in 1993 in Wanganui from 6th to 14th February.

NEW ZEALAND VETERANS - 1992

As most of you will be aware the Annual Veterans Championships will be held at Palmerston North next Easter. on Monday evening 7 Sept.and Senior and Veterans Teams and other
events from Tuesday 8 Sept. to Saturday 12 September.

SURVEY OF MEMBERS

39 Forms were returned most of them fully completed with a number of comments.

The summary is as follows:

1. 84% were in favour of Medals for B and C Grades.

- 2. 46% favoured continuing with the Special Singles and 54% considered they should not be held. If they continue 50% were in favour of those not entering being allowed to enter one extra event.
- 3. 90% favoured the Tournament being held at Easter.

4. 81% favoured bringing in Over 65 Events.

- 5. 88% supported setting up a Veterans Sub-Committee to oversee the seedings and Draws.
- 6. 75% favoured restriction on entries to two age groups and 65% of the 17 who responded to the second question favoured a restriction to six events.
- 7. 80% considered the entry fees to be too high with most favouring around 25% reduction for 40's and 50's and up to 50% reduction for 60's and 70's.
- 8. 68% favoured the Medal Winners of Teams Events being restricted to New Zealand Association Teams but there was no opposition to Overseas or Composite Teams competing and being awarded Certificates.

9. 64% preferred Over 40 Ratings and 36% Over 45 but 82% felt there should be ratings for more than one age group.

- 10. 92% opposed Veterans Events being taken away from the National Championships and 89% opposed them being taken away from the North and South Island Championships.
- 11. Other Comments:

More time be set aside for discussion at Easter. The Veterans Sub-Committee consist of 3 players. That a Veterans Liaison Officer with the NZTTA be appointed. An Australian player considers that having B and C Grade events is a major attraction but the A Grade winners should be the Champioship Winners.

Older Age Groups should be scheduled first.

If Special Singles continue they should be held after the conclusiof the main events.

That fees be aligned with National Championships.

The summary will be passed on to the New Zealand Management Committee and the National Council to ensure they consider the views of our Newsletter Club Members before making any major decisions on the future of New Zealand Table Tennis.
