

REPORT TO THE NEW ZEALAND TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

1991 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS AND MASTERS GAMES

These two events were held at the Brisbane Table Tennis Stadium from 13-18 October. Sixteen players from New Zealand participated in the Individual Events and Fourteen in the New Zealand Teams. On Saturday morning 12 October players from over 30 different sports assembled in Central Brisbane and then took part in a march through the City as part of the Opening Ceremony for the Masters Games. There were plenty of Kiwis in the big crowd of spectators and our players were recognised and given many shouts of encouragement during the march,

On Sunday morning at a meeting of Association Managers there was unanimous support for New Zealand players having equal treatment to Australians for inclusion in composite teams now called Presidents Teams and this has been recommended to the Australian T.T.Assn.

1992 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

This Tournament will be held in Canberra from 18-24 October, 1992 at the ACT Hockey Centre; Mouatt Street, Lyneham. Isabel Cleland has been in Canberra recently and did a lot of checking on suitable accommodation. One of them is within easy walking distance of the Stadium but has only one room units at a cost of \$79 per night for 2 and \$69 for 1. The other one is 4½ kms from the Stadium and has one bedroom units at \$56 per night for 2 and also 2 bedroom units ideal for a group of 4 at \$72 per night. Even with the daily cost of transport to the Stadium it could still save \$20 each per night for a group of 4 or \$13 each for a group of 3. Both are open to negotiation for group bookings and I would like to get that going early in the New Year. If you are interested in going please let me know as soon as possible.

The NZTTA Razor Gang have acted like politicians. Veterans events as from 1993 will no longer be part of the National Championships and will not be in the North or South Island Champs. unless the host Association decides to include them. What has been done I consider to be illegal as there was no remit or proper information sent to Associations before the A.G.M. It was on the Agenda as a discussion item only and Delegates didn't have the time to fully consider the paper distributed at the meeting. The main reason given for cutting out Veterans Events was that there wasn't enough time to fit them in but in working out the time available 30 minutes had been allowed

for 3 set matches when 20 minutes is quite sufficient. Believe it or not in the teams events only 13 minutes was allowed for the same 3 set match. Would anybody agree that you can get through a 3 set teams match in 17 minutes less than the same match in an individual event. Don't let your Association be mislead by this ask them to study the document and consider approaching the NZTTA with a request that this matter be kept on hold until the 1993 A.G.M. with all Associations being given time to fully consider any up to date information prior to the meeting. You may not have heard but this has been done at a time when the Hillary Commission is asking all sports to provide more time for involvement of Veterans.


