



Accommodation has been booked at the Lindy Lodge Motel which is within walking distance of the Stadium. There is no spare accommodation but if anybody else is going and they want accommodation I would be willing to arrange it. Entry forms for the Veterans will be sent through the N.Z.T.T.A. and I will liaise with Merv Allardyce to make sure that those who require them will get them. I have got an entry form for the Masters Tournament and a copy is enclosed for those who have indicated they will be going. If anybody else wants one please let me know and I will send you one.

There have changes recently in flights to Australia so it is recommended that you check with a travel agent and make your booking but don't pay now wait until the last day required as there may be special fares come up as there was last year just in time for us to save many dollars.

South Island Championships— To be held in Invercargill from $\overline{16}$ — 18 June, entries close Tuesday 23 May. North Island Championships— To be held in Auckland from 7-9 July, entries close Monday 29 May.

Both of these major tournaments now have doubles events in the Over 35, Over 45 and Over 55's and also have B and C Grade singles. This means that the veterans can get many more games than in previous years. If you want an entry form contact your local Association immediately as time is running out.

Australian Veterans and Masters Championships

Entry forms have finally arrived and have been distributed to those who have indicated that they are going. I was surprised to see they had changed the eligibility date and asked Merv. Allardyce to check it with Australia. However, as I wanted to get this Newsletter out without any further delay I rang the Tournament Secretary in Adelaide who checked it with the South Australia and Australian T.T.A.'s. She rang me back within a few hours and said they had made a mistake and the eligibility birth years are in fact $\underline{1949}$, $\underline{1939}$, $\underline{1929}$ and $\underline{1919}$. This is good news as it allows 4 of our players to enter older age groups. The entry fee for the Masters Tournament, which includes the Registration Fee, is \$30 but all those who enter will be given 2 \$5 Vouchers by the South Australian Assn. which can be used for meals at the Stadium. This will in real terms reduce the entry fee to \$20.

1989 National Championships at Timaru

There was a big drop in the number of entries in the Over 45 and Over 55 Events which can only be attributed to the spread of events over 5 days caused by a combination with Junior Events. This was allowed despite a NZTTA policy that Seniors and Juniors National Championships shall not be held at the same time. Over 55 Womens Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles could not be held because of a lack of entries which compares sadly with the North Island Championships and the 1988 Nationals when they were all held. The total Over 55 entries in Singles and Doubles was 11 compared with 37 in 1988 and the Over 45's was 64 compared with 86 in 1988.

1990

4th N.Z. Veterans Championships to be held at Christchurch. The Canterbury Association propose to hold it over 3 days, Saturday 14 to Monday 16 April with $1\frac{1}{2}$ days for Teams and $1\frac{1}{2}$ days for individual events. It will be preceded on Friday 13 April by the Canterbury Open which also includes a Veterans (Over 45's) and Seniors (Over 35's).

5th Veterans World Championships at Baltimore, USA, June 8-12.

South Island Championships at Timaru, tentative dates 15-17 June

North Island Championships at Napier 6-8 July will include Hawkes Bay's 50th Jubilee Celebrations.

National Championships at the Town and Horticultural Halls Lower Hutt 31 August to 8 September. Veterans schedule - North v South Tuesday 4 September at 7.00 pm. Over 40 Teams Wed./Thurs. 5 & 6 September. Individual Events Frid./Sat. 7 & 8 September. Social Saturday Evening 8 September.

Australian Veterans dates not yet available but probably at Hobart in November, 1990.

1991

N.Z. Masters Games to be held at Wanganui 5-10 February, 1991. They are already sending out newsletters so if you are interested and want to get on their list write to: National Mutual N.Z., Masters Games, P.O. Box 500, Wanganui.

World Table Tennis Championships will be held in Chiba City, Japan (about 40 Km south of Tokyo) from April 24 (Wed) to May 6 (Mon.), 1991. There is direct access by sea and air through Chiba Sea Port on one side of the City and Narita Airport on the other side. It will be a once in a lifetime opportunity for Veterans as they are going to hold a "Ladies and Masters" Tournament at the same time which is open to everybody to enter. Roy Gregory will certainly be pleased at the name and no doubt we will get a Remit at the AGM next March to change our Annual Veterans to the same name.
