PRESENTATION EVENING 23 JUNE, 1994

The Mayor of Lower Hutt Mr.Glen Evans, presents International Awards to John Lelliott.

The Trophy from America is for the "Performance of the Century" for achieving 50 Years 'A' Grade Table Tennis. The Medal is from England and is tabelled "inter-National Order of Merit for services to Table Tennis.

Subsequently the American Biographical Centre has named him "Man of the Year" and the Internation. Biographical Centre in England has given another Medal labelled "The 20th Century Award for Achiev ment" for 50 Years "A" Grade Table Tennis. It is quite clear from these Awards that Table Tennis has a much higher profile in the World than it has in New Zealand.





1994 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

This Annual Tournament was held in Perth from 1st to 8th October. Eight players from New Zealand took part but the overall number of entries was higher than the previous year in New South Wales. TEAMS - The Over 40 Womens Team of Lynley Barker, Val Beaver and Averil Roberts did well finishing 3rd with 5 wins and 2 losses, all three finished with 52% with 11 wins and 10 losses. The Over 50 Mens Team of John Lelliott, Eddie Millard and Eddie Moore finished 7th out of 10 with 3 wins and 6 losses. Lelliott and Moore both beat New South Wales top player, Ken Cole, who had recently won the New Zealand Over 45 Title. Lelliott got 62%, Moore 26% and Millard 22%.

Kevin Fogarty won 37% in an Over 40 Mens Presidents Team and Janice Stead got 33% in a Presidents Over 50 Womens Team.

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

Lynley Barker did well in a strong field to get to the Quarter Finals in the Over 40 Womens Singles and Doubles. The only Medals won were by John Lelliott who caused a big upset by beating the Australian No.1 in the Over 60's Quarter Final, Bill Bates from Victoria, 21-18 15-21 21-5, he then beat Tom Sal in the Semi-Final 21-15 22-20 and Tony Herbert of Queensland in the Final 21-16 21-15 to win a Gold Medal. He also won a Bronze in the Over 60 Mens Doubles with Tom Sal of Victoria.

In the Merit Rankings Lynley Barker was No.10 in the Over 40 Women and Val Beaver No.12.

1995 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS AND MASTERS GAMES

Both of these Tournaments are being held in Melbourne with the Masters Games scheduled for 6-8 October and the Veterans from 14-21 October. Normally the Veterans are held straight after the Masters Games which is the best system for those travelling from around Australia and from New Zealand. In Perth when the dates were disclosed a number of Australians and some from New Zealand asked for Victoria to consider changing the dates but there doesn't appear to be much chance of a change. However, any of you who wish to enter the Veterans and/or the Masters, who need accommodation please let me know as soon as possible as there are a lot of things going on in Melbourne in October and accommodation could be hard to get.


