1995 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

A very enjoyable trip for all the players although the Over 40 Womens Team didn't do as well as expected having close 5-6 losses to 3 Teams they were expected to beat. Their only other loss was to the Group Winner, South Australia, so they finished 4th on a countback. Val Beaver did well with 71% wins, Averil Roberts had 48% and Lynley Barker 43%.

The Over 50 Mens Team finished 7th and missed out on 6th place with a 5-6 loss to South Australia. Chip Eade had 50% wins, John Lelliott 42% and Eddie Millard 25%. The highlight of the Teams Event for Chip and John was giving the Over 50 Champion a fright when they both took Inh Van Le to three and came close to taking away his unbeaten record.

In the Presidents Teams Kevin Fogarty had 43%, Janice Stead 22%, Isabel Cleland 67% and Bill Joker 20%.

In the Individual Events Val Beaver and Averil Roberts, Seeded 8th beat the Top Seeds, P.Comerford and P.Tait(Vic)in the Quarter-Final 16-21 21-16 21-11, they beat the 5th Seeds C.Healy/J.Tregea (Qld) in the Semi-Final 21-14 21-18 but lost to the 2nd Seeds, A.Strack/J.Whisson(Qld) in the Final 21-16 12-21 14-21. A good win of Silver Medals in a strong Over 40 Womens Doubles field. John Lelliott won Bronze Medals in the Over 60 Mixed Doubles with Elaine Edwards and in the Over 60 Mens Doubles with Tom Sal. In the Order of Merit Lists Val Beaver was No.7 in the Over 40 Women and Isabel Cleland No.4 in the Over 70 Women.

IT'S GOT TO BE GOOD FOR YOU

Sport is for life. The sheer number of people involved in Masters and Veterans sport show that New Zealanders really do believe in the value of lifetime activity. And that's great for the health and well-being of our nation.

Masters and Veterans sport has gathered real momentum over the past two decades. The concept is attractive to former competitors wanting to return to sport, as well as newcomers to competitive activity.

Studies have shown that older participants are drawn to Masters and Veterans sport by a combination of three main factors:

- the physical benefits of being fit;
- the psychological benefits of sport and fitness;
- the social value of being involved in sport.

IS YOUR SPORTS CLUB ACTIVELY AGEING?

Most sports clubs are keen to recruit new members. Fresh faces can add a vitality and vigour - not to mention boosting membership numbers and income!

However, many clubs fail to put any effort into recruiting older adults. What they don't realise is that bringing Masters and Veterans into the club can bring benefits and, in many cases, offer vast experience as well.

Masters and Veterans members can help your club in the following ways:

- by providing enthusiastic and inspirational role models for younger members;
- by encouraging a "family" or team spirit of support and co-operation through a diversity of members;
- by offering a lifetime's experience to your sport, often as coaches, referees and administrators;
- by offering vast experience in business, promotions and other useful occupations;
- by adding a new dimension to social activities.

IN MANY CASES, OLDER REALLY DOES MEAN WISER.

WHAT YOU NEED TO CONSIDER FOR MASTERS AND VETERANS

Regular exercise, when adjusted to suit the age and ability of participants, can be of great benefit to a person's health and wellbeing. However, exercise without enjoyment is like champagne without bubbles - boring. If exercise is to be of any benefit at all, it must be FUN. To attract Masters and Veterans members to your club or activity you should:

 provide information about your club and what it offers;

- make facilities and programmes readily available to older participants;
- adapt fields, courts or rules to help older participants enjoy the activity;
- avoid putting them in embarrassing situations;
- let them participate at their own pace - people should not be forced to keep up with others in the group;
- provide opportunities to socialise
 this is one of the main reasons
 that over 35s take up or return to
 sport.

MARKETING YOUR CLUB

The greatest response to a request for new members may come from potential Masters and Veterans participants who are apprehensive about becoming involved in sport. They may lack confidence, or they may have been out of sport for several years and need extra motivation to haul out their sports gear again.

The following suggestions may prove useful:

- arrange a have-a-go session/day with supervision provided;
- arrange a drop-in/have-a-go programme held on a morning or afternoon each week (supervision provided);
- try a "bring a friend" session where regular members introduce a new person;
- do not insist on registration;
- do not insist on the correct sportswear or uniform (perhaps

- with the exclusion of suitable footwear);
- charge only a minimal fee (perhaps the first session could be free);
- arrange a session or game where interested people can come and watch the sport;
- form a sub-committee to deal exclusively with potential new members in the Masters and Veterans age group to provide follow-up after activities are completed;
- appoint an appropriate person who can act as co-ordinator to cater for new members and can go into the community and speak to various groups;
- consider whether your meeting place is well known in the community. How accessible is it?





AUSTRALIAN VETERANS

The Australian Veterans 1996 Championships will be held at Adelaide in the Clipsal Powerhouse Basketball Stadium. 44A Crittendon Road, Findon, South Australia about 10 Minutes drive from the City Centre. It will be a bit later than usual and will commence on Sunday 3rd November and the latest news is that it should finish on Saturday 9 November. Accommodation may be limited due to a clash with other events so if anybody is interested in going let me know as soon as possible and we will try and help with arranging accommodation.

1996 MAJOR TOURNAMENTS

There will be changes to all the normal dates this year due to the introduction of the 4 Term School Year. The North Island Championships will be held at Wanganui over Queens Birthday Weekend from 1-3 June. The National Senior Championships will be at Auckland from 8-13 July but the Juniors will be from 22-27 September at Auckland. The South Island Championships are at Dunedin from 9-11 August. NEW ZEALAND RATING SYSTEM

There have been many changes to the system. All Association Open Tournaments except extra ones like Easter Opens are now on the list with Mens and Womens Open Singles, Over 40's, Over 50's, Under 21's, Under 19's, Under 17's and Under 15's all qualifying for points. There will be less points for Veterans and Junior Age Group Events to avoid them going too high on the Open Lists. This should be an improvement to the previous system but don't forget "To Err is Human but to foul things up completely requires a Computer".

NEW ZEALAND ASSOCIATION

"Our President (Ron Garrett) is a self made man and Worships his Creator".

As you are probably aware within a few months the Management Committee and National Council will no longer exist and will be replaced by a Board of Governors which will "Consist of Six Persons: Chosen to Decide; Whether New Zealand Table Tennis Will Survive".

A new Constitution will be considered at a Special General Meeting to be held in Auckland during the National Championships in July.

1996 NEW ZEALAND MASTERS GAMES

The Masters Games held in Dunedin 9-11 February was very successful Numbers were well up on 1994 from 72 to 96 and well organised. including the biggest number ever from the North Island. was plenty of evidence to prove George Bernard Shaw was correct in his statement "We do not cease to play because we grow old, we grow old because we cease to play".

Harry and Barbara Dye celebrated their 40th Wedding Anniversary with a win in the Over 55 Mixed Doubles. Just a few days before, on Waitangi Day, Harry had also celebrated his 21st Birthday(the A number of well known South Island players from the 3rd one). past took part including Neville Brightwell, Bill Fogarty and his daughter_Yvonne. Brian Foster was there but didn't play but his wife Ruth played well winning all the Over 45 Events. Bryan is back to making the Foster Tables which are very good value at \$600.

Every evening there were Social Functions at the Big Tent which attracted several hundred players from the 63 sports, including many Table Tennis players. One evening called the Bavarian Night there were 8 pages of popular old songs distributed and many of them were sung. On the Saturday afternoon there was a Rugby Match for retired players, such as Grant Fox, against Australia which ended in a 44-44 Draw.

On the same evening there was a Netball Match against Australia which New Zealand won 35-33 in a very exciting contest. It was hard to believe that Sandra Edge had retired, she looked fitter and was moving faster than any of our top New Zealand Table Tennis players.


