OBITUARY

John joined the Empire Table Tennis Club in 1974 and didn't waste time getting involved. Two years later he was on the New Zealand Table Tennis Executive and spent 11 years there. He managed the New Zealand teams at the 1985 World and Commonwealth championships and organised three national championships.

At Veterans level in 1989 he set up this National Veterans Newsletter Club and organised annual trips across the Tasman to take part in Australian Veteran championships and Masters Games. He played A Grade for Empire for 25 years but would proudly boast he had played A Grade for double that. His single-mindedness in his play meant he would never give away a point even at club level. His medal tally at competitions here and in Australia was in the hundreds of gold, silver and bronze.

For Hutt Valley Table Tennis his contribution was immense. He held the positions of President, Vice-President, Chairman and Secretary. He was also a Life Member of the Association. He also played very successfully as a Veteran and won a large number of New Zealand titles and three Australian titles. However, perhaps his most memorable achievement was reaching the quarter final of the 1998 World Veteran Over 70 Mens Singles, when he was narrowly beaten by the eventual winner.

John set up the HVTTA development trust, assisting local players representing New Zealand with funding for overseas trips. He spent many hours promoting table tennis amongst school aged players and organising competitions for them. A Hutt News reporter said John would be one of the hardest working sports administrators he has encountered.

An arthritis sufferer for many years following a cartilage injury he was a firm advocate of 'move it or lose it' but two years ago ill-health finally forced him from full involvement in the game which had been his total focus for so long.

John died on 27 May. He is survived by his children Janice (Guatemala), Michael (Christchurch) and Gillian (Cairns), his former wife Kathleen and 5 grandchildren.

Val won 14 of the 18 matches played, Averil 12 from 18 and Lynley 10 from 18.
